## IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA JUNE 29, 2023

To amend, on an emergency basis, the Rental Housing Act of 1985 to limit for 2 years the annual adjustment of general applicability of the rent charged in rent stabilized units to the lesser of 6% or the Standard Metropolitan Statistical Area Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers plus 2% with a 2-year cumulative limit of 12%, to limit for 2 years the annual adjustment of the rent charged in rent stabilized units leased or co-leased by a home and community-based services waiver provider the lesser of 4% or the adjustment of general applicability with a 2-year cumulative limit of 8%, and to limit for 2 years the annual adjustment in the amount of rent charged while a unit is occupied by an elderly tenant or tenant with a disability to the lesser of 4%, the adjustment of general applicability, or the most recent annual cost-of-living adjustment of benefits for social security recipients with a 2-year cumulative limit of 8%.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the "Rent Stabilized Housing Inflation Protection Emergency Amendment Act of 2023".

Sec. 2. Title II of the Rental Housing Act of 1985, effective July 17, 1985 (D.C. Law 6-10; D.C. Official Code § 42-3502.01 *et seq.*), is amended as follows:

(a) Section 208 (D.C. Official Code § 42-3502.08) is amended as follows:

- (1) Subsection (h)(2) is amended as follows:
  - (A) Subparagraph (A) is amended as follows:
    - (i) The existing text is designated as sub-subparagraph (i).
    - (ii) A new sub-subparagraph (ii) is added to read as follows:

"(ii) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-subparagraph (i) of this subparagraph, adjustments that take effect from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2025, shall not exceed the current allowable amount of rent charged for the unit plus the adjustment of general applicability plus 2%, taken as a percentage of the current allowable amount of rent charged; provided, that the total adjustment shall not exceed 6%;".

(B) Subparagraph (C) is amended as follows:

- (i) The existing text is designated as sub-subparagraph (i).
- (ii) A new sub-subparagraph (ii) is added to read as follows:

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"(ii) Notwithstanding sub-subparagraph (i) of this subparagraph, adjustments that take effect from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2025, shall not exceed the current allowable amount of rent charged for the unit plus the lesser of 4% or the adjustment of general applicability if the unit is leased or co-leased by a home and community-based services waiver provider."

(2) New subsections (i) and (j) are added to read as follows:

"(i)(1) Notwithstanding section 904(b) (D.C. Official Code § 42-3509.04(b)), any notices of rent increases issued pursuant to subsection (h)(2) of this section for which the rent increase shall be effective on or after July 1, 2023, may be re-noticed with less than 30 days' notice if the rent increase is lower than the rent increase in the original notice."

"(2) Any payment of rent in excess of the legal allowable rent charged that was made in accordance with notices of rent increases issued prior to the effective date of this act shall be repaid to the payer within 30 days after overpayment or by August 1, 2023, whichever is later.

"(j) Notwithstanding subsection (h)(2) of this section, the total amount of adjustments from May 1, 2023 through April 30, 2025, shall not exceed the legal rent charged on April 30, 2023, for the unit plus:

"(1) 8%, if the unit is occupied by an elderly tenant or tenant with a disability, or if the unit is leased or co-leased by a home and community-based services waiver provider; or "(2) 12%, if the unit is occupied by any other tenant.".

(b) Section 224 (D.C. Official Code § 42-3502.24) is amended by adding a new subsection (a-1) to read as follows:

"(a-1) Notwithstanding section 208(h) or subsection (a) of this section, an adjustment that takes effect from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2025, in the amount of rent charged while a unit is occupied by an elderly tenant or tenant with a disability, without regard to income, shall not exceed the rent charged for the unit, plus the least of:

"(1) The adjustment of general applicability;

"(2) The most recent annual cost-of-living adjustment of benefits for social security recipients established pursuant to section 415(i) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. § 415(i)); or "(3) 4% of the rent charged.".

Sec. 3. Fiscal impact statement.

The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement of the Budget Director as the fiscal impact statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act of 1975, approved October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D.C. Official Code § 1-301.47a).

Sec. 4. Effective date.

This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), and shall remain in effect for no longer than 90 days, as provided for emergency acts of the Council of the District of Columbia in section

#### IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

#### JUNE 29, 2023

To amend, on an emergency basis, the Legalization of Marijuana for Medical Treatment Initiative of 1999 to provide that the 5 cultivation center registration applicants that scored 150 points or more after submitting a medical cannabis facility registration application to the Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Board during the open application period that occurred between November 29, 2021 and March 28, 2022, shall be considered for a manufacturer license.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the "Medical Cannabis Manufacturer Clarification Emergency Amendment Act of 2023".

Sec. 2. Section 7 of the Legalization of Marijuana for Medical Treatment Initiative of 1999, effective February 25, 2010 (D.C. Law 13-315; D.C. Official Code § 7-1671.06), is amended by adding new subsection (y) to read as follows:

"(y) The 5 cultivation center registration applicants that submitted medical cannabis facility registration applications to the ABC Board between November 29, 2021 and March 28, 2022, that scored 150 points or more shall be considered by the ABC Board for a manufacturer license after the effective date of the Medical Cannabis Manufacturer Clarification Emergency Amendment Act of 2023, passed on emergency basis on June 6, 2023 (Enrolled version of Bill 25-303); provided, that the applicant files a manufacturer license application with the ABC Board by May 1, 2024."

Sec. 3. Fiscal impact statement.

The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement of the Budget Director as the fiscal impact statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act of 1975, approved October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D.C. Official Code § 1-301.47a).

Sec. 4. Effective date.

This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), and shall remain in effect for no longer than 90 days, as provided for emergency acts of the Council of the District of Columbia in section 412(a) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 788; D.C. Official Code § 1-204.12(a)).

#### IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

#### JUNE 29, 2023

To amend, on a temporary basis, the Fair Meals Delivery Act of 2022 to prohibit a third-party meal delivery service from excluding any restaurant with whom the third-party meal delivery service has an agreement from a customer within 4 miles of a restaurant, to restrict third-party meal delivery services from reducing a restaurant's delivery radius below 4 miles based on the level or percentage of commissions paid, to restrict thirdparty meal delivery services from limiting driver availability based on the level or percentage of commissions paid, to require third-party meal delivery services to disclose, in plain language, all fees, commissions, and charges related to contracted services for covered restaurants, and to make other clarifying changes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the "Food Delivery Fees Transparency Temporary Amendment Act of 2023".

Sec. 2. The Fair Meals Delivery Act of 2022, effective March 10, 2023 (D.C. Law 24-292; D.C. Official Code § 48-651 *et seq.*), is amended as follows:

(a) The long title is amended by striking the word "platform" wherever it appears and inserting the word "service" in its place.

(b) Section 2 (D.C. Official Code § 48-651) is amended as follows:

(1) Paragraph (1) is amended by striking the word "platform" and inserting the word "service" in its place.

(2) Paragraph (2) is amended to read as follows:

"(2) "Core delivery service" means a service that lists a restaurant and makes the restaurant discoverable on all third-party meal delivery platforms where a third-party meal delivery service lists restaurants and facilitates or performs the delivery through employees or independent contractors of the third-party meal delivery service of food or beverages from restaurants to customers. The term "core delivery service" does not include any other service that may be provided by a third-party meal delivery service to a restaurant, including advertising or other promotional services, search engine optimization, business consulting, or credit card processing.".

(3) New paragraphs (2A) and (2B) are added to read as follows:

"(2A) "Covered restaurant" means a restaurant that elects to receive only core delivery service.

"(2B) "Delivery radius" means the circular delivery area from around a restaurant within which customers can search for and order from a restaurant.".

(4) Paragraph (6) is amended by striking the phrase "by, and same-day delivery, and the" and inserting the phrase "by, and provides the" in its place.

(5) A new paragraph (6A) is added to read as follows:

"(6A) "Third-party meal delivery service" means a person that operates a thirdparty meal delivery platform.".

(c) Section 3 (D.C. Official Code § 48-652) is amended as follows:

(1) The section heading is amended by striking the phrase "meals delivery platforms" and inserting the phrase "meal delivery services" in its place.

(2) Subsection (a) is amended by striking the word "platform" both times it appears and inserting the word "service" in its place.

(3) Subsection (b) is amended by striking the word "platform" both times it appears and inserting the word "service" in its place.

(4) Subsection (c) is amended as follows:

(A) Paragraph (1) is amended by striking the word "platform" and inserting the word "service" in its place.

(B) Paragraph (2) is amended by striking the word "platform" and inserting the word "service" in its place.

(5) Subsection (d) is amended by striking the phrase "platform that" and inserting the phrase "service that" in its place.

(6) New subsections (e), (f), and (g) are added to read as follows:

"(e) A third party meal delivery service shall not exclude any restaurant with whom the third-party meal delivery service has an agreement from a customer within 4 miles of a restaurant.

"(f) A third-party meal delivery service shall not reduce the delivery radius of a covered restaurant below 4 miles, based on the level or percentage of commissions paid.

"(g) A third-party meal delivery service shall not reduce the availability of delivery drivers provided to a covered restaurant, based on the level or percentage of commissions paid; provided, that this subsection shall not be construed to restrict a third-party meal delivery service's ability to use any method (that does not conflict with the restrictions in this subsection or any other applicable law) to offer expedited or priority driver services to a covered restaurant that pays for such services on a third-party meal delivery platform.".

(d) Section 4 (D.C. Official Code § 48-653) is amended as follows:

(1) Strike the phrase ", the third-party meal delivery platform" and insert the phrase ", the third-party meal delivery service" in its place.

(2) Strike the phrase "platform ("charges")" and inserting the phrase "service ("charges")" in its place.

(e) A new section 4a is added to read as follows:

"Sec. 4a. Restaurant disclosure requirement.

"A third-party meal delivery service shall:

"(1) Disclose to a covered restaurant, in plain language, the fees, commissions, and charges associated with the contracted services in the agreement; and

"(2) Maintain all contracts with covered restaurants in its records for 3 years after the date the agreement is executed.".

(f) Section 5 (D.C. Official Code § 48-654) is amended as follows:

(1) Subsection (a) is amended as follows:

(A) Strike the phrase "third-party meal delivery platform" both times it appears and insert the phrase "third-party meal delivery service" in its place.

(B) Strike the phrase "platform does" and insert the phrase "third-party meal delivery service does" in its place.

(2) Subsection (b) is amended as follows:

(A) The lead-in language is amended by striking the word "platform" and inserting the word "service" in its place.

(B) Paragraph (2) is amended by striking the word "platform" and inserting the word "service" in its place.

(g) Section 6 (D.C. Official Code § 48-655) is amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 6. Third-party delivery platform; registration requirement.

"A third-party food delivery service operating in the District shall register with the Department of Licensing and Consumer Protection.".

Sec. 3. Fiscal impact statement.

The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement of the Budget Director as the fiscal impact statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act of 1975, approved October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D.C. Official Code § 1-301.47a).

Sec. 4. Effective date.

(a) This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 30-day period of congressional review as provided in section 602(c)(1) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December

24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(1)), and publication in the District of Columbia Register.

(b) This act shall expire after 225 days of its having effect.

#### IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

#### June 13, 2023

To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to enact and amend provisions of law necessary to support the Fiscal Year 2024 budget.

RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "Fiscal Year 2024 Budget Support Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2023".

Sec. 2. (a) The Fiscal Year 2024 Budget Support Act of 2023, passed on 2nd reading on June 13, 2023 (Enrolled version of Bill 25-202) ("Permanent Act"), contains various measures necessary to support the Fiscal Year 2024 Budget and Financial Plan.

(b) There are several time-sensitive provisions contained in the Permanent Act that apply before October 1, 2023, and therefore need to be effective in advance of that date.

(c) Other provisions in the Permanent Act that apply as of October 1, 2023, also should be enacted prior to that date to allow agencies and stakeholders to prepare for implementation.

Sec. 3. The Council determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the Fiscal Year 2024 Budget Support Emergency Act of 2023 be adopted after a single reading.

Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

WHEREAS, Joseph "JoJo" Woodland is a 22-year old Ward 7 resident and adult Special Olympics athlete who was selected from over 500,000 athletes across the United States to represent Special Olympics USA at the World Games Berlin 2023 being held June 17-25, 2023, an event that occurs every 2 years when the world transcends the boundaries of geography, nationality, political philosophy, gender, age, culture, and religion to come together;

WHEREAS, Joseph "JoJo" Woodland previously competed in the 2022 USA Games in Orlando, where he earned a bronze medal in the 400m, and in the 2018 USA Games in Seattle, where he earned a silver medal in soccer;

WHEREAS, Joseph "JoJo" Woodland runs in the city and completes track workouts with his coach as part of his training regimen;

WHEREAS, the GALA Hispanic Theatre provides opportunities for the Latino artist, educates youth, and engages the entire community in an exchange of ideas and perspectives;

WHEREAS, Mr. Medrano believed that exceptional artistry transcends language, class, and cultural differences, and that all in our community deserve access to it and to have their stories told;

WHEREAS, Mr. Medrano was committed to nurturing young Latino talent and expanding the appreciation of Latino and Hispanic theater in the U.S;

WHEREAS, Mr. Medrano acted in, directed, or produced nearly three hundred productions throughout his tenure;

## PR25-304, the Local Rent Supplement Program Contract No. 2022-ALRSP-04A with Jubilee Ontario Place LP Approval Resolution of 2023

This measure would affirmatively approve a proposed multiyear contract between the District of Columbia Housing Authority (DCHA) and Jubilee Ontario Place LP, the developer of an affordable housing project. The proposed contract represents DCHA's commitment to enter into a long-term subsidy contract and to support the housing costs of 23 low-income households through the Local Rent Supplement Program. DCHA selected this developer's affordable housing project for LRSP support as part of a consolidated request for proposals with the Department of Housing and Community Development and other housing finance agencies and instrumentalities of the District government.

DCHA transmitted the resolution and a corresponding contract summary package to the Council, and the contract package became publicly available through the Council's Legislative Information Management System (LIMS) on June 28, 2023. It is listed in LIMS as CA25-0292.

Under section 451(c)(3) of the Home Rule Act (D.C. Official Code § 1-204.51(c)(3)), multiyear contracts require the Council's affirmative approval within 45 days of transmittal. At present, the Council's only remaining Legislative Meeting before its annual summer recess is scheduled for July 11, 2023. Consideration at the July 11 Legislative Meeting is the only opportunity to avoid passive disapproval of the LRSP contract described in this notice. Publication in the Register of a notice of intent to act on these measures 15 days before the July 11 Legislative Meeting was not feasible based on the timing of transmittal, but the need to consider this affordable housing project constitutes good cause for abbreviated notice under Council rule 421(a)(2).

# **NOTICE OF FINAL RULEMAKING**

The Interim Director of the Department of Health, pursuant to the authority set forth in Section 302(14) of the District of Columbia Health Occupations Revision Act of 1985 ("Act"), effective March 25, 1986 (D.C. Law 6-99; D.C. Official Code § 3-1203.02(14)), and Mayor's Order 98-140, dated August 20, 1998, hereby gives notice of the adoption of the following amendments to Sections 6610 (Continuing Education Requirements) and Section 6699 (Definitions) of Chapter 66 (Professional Counseling) of Title 17 (Business, Occupations, and Professionals) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations ("DCMR").

The purpose of this rulemaking is to amend the professional counseling regulations to include the requirement for continuing education focusing on patients or clients who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, gender nonconforming, queer, or who question their sexual orientation or gender identity and expression ("LGBTQ+") in accordance with Section 510(b)(5) of the Act (D.C. Official Code § 3-1205.10(b)(5)). In addition, the rulemaking includes the requirement that ten percent (10%) of the continuing education required for the renewal of a license be in public health priorities of the District as determined and published periodically by the Director.

A Notice of Proposed Rulemaking was published in the *District of Columbia Register* on February 17, 2023 at 70 DCR 002259. No public comments were received but, upon review, the Department changed the grammar of the sentences requiring education for clarification and to added a plus sign after LGBTQ to encompass the full range of gender identifications. The Interim Director adopted the rules as final on May 4, 2023. The rules shall become effective on the date of the publication of this notice in the *District of Columbia Register*.

# CHAPTER 66 (PROFESSIONAL COUNSELING) OF TITLE 17 (BUSINESS, OCCUPATIONS, AND PROFESSIONALS) OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA MUNICIPAL REGULATIONS is amended as follows:

#### SECTION 6610, CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS, is amended as follows:

#### Subsection 6610.4 is amended to read as follows:

- 6610.4 An applicant for the renewal of a license shall submit proof of having completed forty (40) hours of approved continuing education credit during the two (2)-year period preceding the date the license expires, which shall include the following:
  - (a) Six (6) hours in ethics;
  - (b) Four (4) hours in trauma counseling;
  - (c) Two (2) hours of LGBTQ+; and
  - (d) At least ten percent (10%) of the total in subjects determined by the Director to be the public health priorities of the District, which shall be

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duly updated and published every five (5) years or as deemed necessary by the Director.

#### Subsection 6610.5 is amended to read as follows:

To qualify for the reactivation of a license, a person in inactive status within the meaning of § 511 of the Act, D.C. Official Code § 3-1205.11, who submits an application to reactivate a license shall submit proof of having completed, within one (1) year prior to application, twenty (20) hours of approved continuing education credit for each license year that the applicant was in inactive status. The total shall include at least six (6) hours in ethics, four (4) hours in trauma counseling, and two (2) hours of LGBTQ+.

#### Subsection 6610.6 is amended to read as follows:

6610.6 To qualify for a license, an applicant for reinstatement of a license shall submit proof of having completed twenty (20) hours of approved continuing education credit for each year that the applicant was not licensed. The total shall include at least six (6) hours in ethics, four (4) hours in trauma counseling, and two (2) hours of LGBTQ+.

#### **SECTION 6699.1, DEFINITIONS, is amended as follows:**

#### The following definition is added before the definition of "General supervision":

**Director** – the Director of the Department of Health or the Director's designee.

# The following definition is added before the definition of "Practice of professional counseling":

**LGBTQ+** – continuing education with instructions on cultural competency or specialized clinical training focusing on patients or clients who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, gender nonconforming, queer, or question their sexual orientation or gender identity and expression ("LGBTQ+") meeting the requirements of § 510(b)(5) of the Act (D.C. Official Code § 3-1205.10(b)(5)).

# **NOTICE OF FINAL RULEMAKING**

The Director of the Department of Human Services ("Department"), pursuant to the authority set forth in Section 31 of the Homeless Services Reform Act of 2005 ("HSRA"), effective October 22, 2005 (D.C. Law 16-35; D.C. Official Code § 4-756.02 (2012 Repl.)), and Mayor's Order 2006-20 dated February 13, 2006, hereby gives notice of the adoption of the following amendment to Chapter 25 (Shelter and Supportive Housing for Individuals and Families) of Title 29 (Public Welfare) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations, to become effective upon publication in the *District of Columbia Register*.

This rulemaking amends the existing Chapter 25 to include requirements and procedures for the Department's Targeted Affordable Housing (TAH) Program, which supports individuals and families in maintaining housing with a permanent housing voucher. Chapter 25 includes the main body of regulations implementing the HSRA and governing the District's homeless services programs administered by the Department. These rules also satisfy the Department's requirement under the Local Rent Supplement Program Enhancement Emergency Amendment Act of 2021 to promulgate rules "governing the referral of applicants to the [District of Columbia Housing] Authority for tenant-based voucher assistance, including eligibility criteria for Targeted Affordable Housing." *See* Section 2042(b)(3) of the Fiscal Year 2022 Budget Support Emergency Act of 2021, effective August 23, 2021 (D.C. Act 24-159; 68 DCR 8602).

These rules were first published as emergency and proposed rules in the *District of Columbia Register* on June 10, 2022, at 69 DCR 006715. The emergency rules were adopted on March 30, 2022, and became effective on that date. A second emergency rulemaking was adopted on July 28, 2022, and published in the *District of Columbia Register* on September 30, 2022, at 69 DCR 011799, and a third emergency rulemaking was published in the *District of Columbia Register* on February 17, 2023, at 70 DCR 002261. These rules are identical to the emergency and proposed rulemaking, in response to which the District received no public comments.

Further, in accordance with Section 31 of the HSRA (D.C. Official Code § 4-756.02), the proposed final rules were submitted to the Council for a forty-five (45) day period of review and were deemed approved on March 2, 2023, pursuant to PR 25-39. On June 26, 2023, the Director of the Department adopted these rules as final, and the rules shall become effective upon publication of this notice in the *District of Columbia Register*.

# Chapter 25, SHELTER AND SUPPORTIVE HOUSING FOR INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES, of Title 29 DCMR, PUBLIC WELFARE, is amended by adding new Sections 2570 through 2573 to read as follows:

# 2570 TARGETED AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROGRAM – PURPOSE AND SCOPE

2570.1 The purpose of the Targeted Affordable Housing Program (TAH) is to combine rental assistance with supportive services to individuals and families who:

- (a) Are chronically homeless or are at risk of chronic homelessness, as defined in Section 2(5A) and (6C) of the Act (D.C. Official Code § 4-751.01(5A) and (6C)), or, in the case of a family, have a household member with a condition described in § 2571.1(c); and
- (b) Do not require monthly case management engagement to remain stably housed.
- 2570.2 Participation in TAH is contingent upon referral through the District's Coordinated Assessment and Housing Placement (CAHP) process and successful application for a rental subsidy through the Local Rent Supplement Program, as administered under Sections 26a and 26c of the District of Columbia Housing Authority Act of 1999, effective March 2, 2007 (D.C. Law 16-192; D.C. Official Code §§ 6-226 and 6-228).
- 2570.3 (a) TAH consists of a rental subsidy and supportive services for an unrestricted period of time.
  - (b) Supportive services may include light touch case management, outreach and engagement, assessment, unit identification assistance, application assistance, and referrals to community-based resources and services.
  - (c) For the purposes of Sections 2570 through 2573, "light touch case management" means case management in which the case manager meets with the client once every month during the first three (3) months after lease-up and once every three (3) months thereafter.
- 2570.4 TAH is a permanent housing program as defined in Section 2(27C) of the Act (D.C. Official Code § 4-751.01(27C)).
- 2570.5 TAH is subject to annual appropriations and the availability of funds.
- 2570.6 Nothing in §§ 2570-2573 shall be construed to create an entitlement, either direct or implied, on the part of any individual or family to TAH.

#### **2571 TAH – ELIGIBILITY AND PRIORITIZATION CRITERIA**

- 2571.1 In order to be eligible for participation in TAH, a client must meet the general eligibility requirements set forth in § 2501 and be:
  - (a) An individual or family that is chronically homeless as defined in Section 2(6C) of the Act (D.C. Official Code § 4-751.01(6C));
  - (b) An individual or family that is at risk of chronic homelessness as defined in Section 2(5A) of the Act (D.C. Official Code § 4-751.01(5A)); or

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- (c) A family with a household member who is diagnosed with substance use disorder, serious mental illness, developmental disability (as defined in D.C. Official Code § 21-1201(3)), post-traumatic stress disorder, cognitive impairments resulting from brain injury, or chronic physical illness or disability.
- A client seeking to participate in TAH may be assessed for eligibility using an evidence-based assessment tool selected by the Department, such as the Service Prioritization Decision Assistance Tool ("SPDAT"), which may be administered by the Department or a provider approved by the Department.
- 2571.3 The Individual Coordinated Assessment and Housing Placement (I-CAHP) or the Family Coordinated Assessment and Housing Placement (F-CAHP), which are part of the District's centralized or coordinated assessment system protocol, as defined in Section 2(6B) of the Act (D.C. Official Code § 4-751.01(6B)) and established according to § 2510, shall be used to prioritize clients for TAH based on prioritization factors described at § 2571.7. The Department shall determine the eligibility of clients prioritized pursuant to I-CAHP or F-CAHP.
- 2571.4 The assessment and contact information for any client seeking to participate in TAH shall be maintained in the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS).
- 2571.5 The Department shall report any TAH vacancies to The Community Partnership (TCP), which serves as the CAHP System Administrator.
- 2571.6 Vacancies in TAH shall be filled by the Department according to the applicable CAHP protocol.
- 2571.7 In accordance with the applicable CAHP protocol, clients shall be referred to TAH subject to priority factors, including:
  - (a) Length of time the client has been chronically homeless or at risk of chronic homelessness;
  - (b) Vulnerability level based on an evidence-based assessment tool selected by the Department, such as the SPDAT or a biopsychosocial assessment conducted by a licensed clinician;
  - (c) Whether a household member, as described in § 2571.1(c), has a condition that likely prevents the head of household from increasing the household's total income beyond thirty percent (30%) of the area median income for a household of the same size;
  - (d) Length of time the client has received rapid re-housing services; and

- (e) Active engagement in case management services and completion (or attempted completion, as documented in case notes) of activities and milestones outlined in the most recent case management plan from a Continuum of Care provider.
- 2571.8 Once a client is assigned to TAH through the CAHP process, the Department shall assign a TAH case manager to the client.

#### 2572 TAH – APPLICATION FOR LRSP RENTAL SUBSIDY

- 2572.1 Assignment to a TAH case manager does not guarantee receipt of an LRSP rental subsidy. The applicant will work with the assigned TAH case manager to complete an application for the LRSP rental subsidy.
- 2572.2 The TAH case manager shall work with the assigned client to ensure the LRSP rental subsidy application is submitted to the District of Columbia Housing Authority (DCHA).
- 2572.3 Upon receipt of notification that DCHA deemed the applicant eligible for an LRSP rental subsidy, the Department shall contact the client and TAH case manager to confirm approval for the LRSP rental subsidy.
- 2572.4 The TAH case manager shall assist the client in complying with DCHA requirements to utilize the LRSP rental subsidy in a timely manner. This may include notifying the client that they must attend a DCHA Voucher Briefing, helping the client to identify a housing unit within six (6) months of the LRSP voucher being issued, or requesting an extension of the utilization period if the client needs additional time to identify and lease up in a unit.
- 2572.5 If DCHA deems the applicant ineligible for LRSP, then the TAH case manager shall work with the client on next steps. For clients who are deemed ineligible for LRSP, the TAH case manager may refer the client for alternative rental assistance for which funding is available. The case manager shall notify the Department if the client is deemed ineligible for LRSP. In addition, the case manager shall notify the Department if alternative rental assistance is not possible.

# **2573 TAH – SUPPORTIVE SERVICES**

- 2573.1 TAH is designed to assist clients who would otherwise qualify for Permanent Supporting Housing pursuant to DCMR §§ 2535-2542 but do not require ongoing, intensive supportive services to maintain housing because they have fewer barriers to housing stability or they are connected to community services.
- 2573.2 TAH combines a rental subsidy with supportive services for an unrestricted period of time. TAH supportive services may include unit identification assistance,

application assistance, ongoing light touch case management, and coordination with the client's landlord.

- 2573.3 The TAH case manager shall meet with the client at least once every month during the first three (3) months after lease-up. Afterward, the TAH case manager shall meet with the client at least once every three (3) months or at some other frequency as agreed upon by the client and the case manager.
- 2573.4 The TAH client shall pay thirty percent (30%) of their household income toward the total rental amount determined by DCHA. The TAH case manager shall confirm if the client is paying their portion of the rent to ensure housing stability.
- 2573.5 The TAH case manager shall inform his/her supervisor in writing if the case manager assesses that the client would be better served with Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) case management. PSH case management consists of intensive case management services.
- 2573.6 It shall be the responsibility of each TAH client to follow rules for reporting changes in income related to their rental subsidy. Any resulting effect of a change in income on the client's rental subsidy shall be made in accordance with the rules and policies of DCHA or other applicable funding source.

#### **Battery Stewardship Infractions**

The Director of the Department of Energy and Environment ("DOEE"), pursuant to the authority set forth in section 104 of the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs Civil Infractions Act of 1985, effective October 5, 1985 (D.C. Law 6-42; D.C. Official Code § 2-1801.04); Mayor's Order 2006-61 dated June 14, 2006; Subtitle D (Extended Producer Responsibility for Batteries) of Title I (Waste Management, Reduction, and Recovery) of the Sustainable Solid Waste Management Amendment Act of 2014, effective March 16, 2021 (D.C. Law 23-211; D.C. Official Code § 8-771.01 *et seq.*); and Mayor's Order 2022-028 dated February, 10, 2022, hereby gives notice of the intent to adopt the following amendments to Chapter 40 (Department of the Environment (DDOE) Infractions) of Title 16 (Consumers, Commercial Practices, and Civil Infractions) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations ("DCMR") in not less than thirty (30) days after the publication of this notice in the *District of Columbia Register*.

This rulemaking will schedule fines for violation of rules related to battery stewardship in Chapter 39 (Battery Stewardship) of Title 20 (Environment) of the DCMR. The rulemaking reflects amendments incorporated into the Sustainable Solid Waste Management Amendment Act of 2014 by the Battery and Electronic Stewardship Amendment Act of 2022, effective March 10, 2023 (D.C. Law 24-320, 70 DCR 3551).

Directions for submitting comments are provided at the end of this notice. After consideration of comments, proposed final rules will be submitted to the Council of the District of Columbia for its review and approval, in accordance with D.C. Official Code § 2-1801.04(a).

Chapter 40, DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT (DDOE) INFRACTIONS, of Title 16 DCMR, CONSUMERS, COMMERCIAL PRACTICES, AND CIVIL INFRACTIONS, is amended as follows:

A new Section 4014, BATTERY STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM INFRACTIONS, is added to read as follows:

#### 4014 BATTERY STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM INFRACTIONS

- 4014.1 [Reserved]
- 4014.2 [Reserved]
- 4014.3 Violation of any of the following provisions shall be a Class 3 infraction:
  - (a) 20 DCMR § 3900.1(b) (failure to fully implement an approved battery stewardship plan or amendment to the plan no later than ninety (90) days after receiving DOEE approval);

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- (b) 20 DCMR § 3900.1(e) (failure to register with DOEE using an agency prepared registration form on or before January 1 of each year);
- (c) 20 DCMR § 3900.1(f) (failure to submit an annual report with the required elements to DOEE on or before June 1 of each year);
- (d) 20 DCMR § 3900.1(g) (failure to submit a proposed amendment to a battery stewardship plan);
- Section 130(b-1) of the Sustainable Solid Waste Management Amendment Act of 2014, effective March 16, 2021 (D.C. Law 23-211; D.C. Official Code § 8-771.03(b-1)) (failure to submit a required amendment to a battery stewardship plan);
- (f) 20 DCMR § 3900.1(h) (failure to submit amended performance goals as required on the anniversary of the approval of the initial battery stewardship plan);
- (g) 20 DCMR § 3900.1(i) (failure to submit the results of an independent assessment of the battery stewardship plan and recommendations to improve the plan);
- (h) 20 DCMR § 3900.2 (failure to submit an amended plan with required corrections or revisions within forty-five (45) days of DOEE notice of rejection or required revision);
- (i) 20 DCMR § 3900.3(a) (failure to provide a safety tutorial as required for a battery collection site designated under an approved plan);
- (j) 20 DCMR § 3900.4 (conducting end-of-life handling that is not in accordance with practices set forth in an approved battery stewardship plan or amendment to the plan);
- (k) 20 DCMR § 3901.1 (failure of a producer to join a battery stewardship organization); or
- (1) 20 DCMR § 3907 (failure of a battery stewardship organization to pay the administrative fee).
- 4014.4 Violation of the following provisions shall be a Class 4 infraction:
  - (a) Section 137(a) of the Sustainable Solid Waste Management Amendment Act of 2014, effective March 16, 2021 (D.C. Law 23-211; D.C. Official Code § 8-771.09(a)) (disposal of primary or rechargeable batteries in the District through means other than battery recycling programs or other

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methods approved by the Mayor by a producer. The disposal of each increment of one (1) to ten (10) batteries shall be a separate violation; or

- (b) Section 137(b) of the Sustainable Solid Waste Management Amendment Act of 2014, effective March 16, 2021 (D.C. Law 23-211; D.C. Official Code § 8–771.09(b)) (knowing disposal of primary or rechargeable batteries in the District through means other than battery recycling programs or other methods approved by the Mayor by any person). The disposal of each increment of one (1) to ten (10) batteries shall be a separate violation.
- 4014.5 Violation of any provision of Subtitle D (Extended Producer Responsibility for Batteries) of Title I (Waste Management, Reduction, and Recovery) of the Sustainable Solid Waste Management Amendment Act of 2014, effective March 16, 2021 (D.C. Law 23-211; D.C. Official Code § 8-771.01 *et seq.*), or the implementing rules in 20 DCMR Chapter 39, that is not cited elsewhere in this section, shall be a Class 5 infraction.

# **NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING**

The Interim Director of the Department of Energy and Environment (DOEE), in accordance with the authority set forth in the District Department of the Environment Establishment Act of 2005, effective February 15, 2006 (D.C. Law 16-51; D.C. Official Code §§ 8-151.01, *et seq.*), sections 5 and 21 of the Water Pollution Control Act of 1984, effective March 16, 1985 (D.C. Law 5-188; D.C. Official Code §§ 8-103.04 and 8-103.20, and Mayor's Order 98-50, dated April 15, 1998, as amended by Mayor's Order 2006-61, dated June 14, 2006, hereby gives notice of the intent to adopt the following amendments to Chapter 11 (Water Quality Standards) of Title 21 (Water and Sanitation) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (DCMR) in not less than 60 days from the date of publication of this notice in the *District of Columbia Register*.

DOEE is conducting the 2021 triennial review of the District of Columbia's Water Quality Standards ("WQS") regulations as required by Section 5(a) of the Water Pollution Control Act (D.C. Official Code § 8-103.04(a)), and Section 303(c) of the federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. § 1313(c)). The purpose of the WQS triennial review is to evaluate the District's WQS regulations and adopt or revise WQS to be consistent with the requirements of the Clean Water Act.

DOEE is proposing to add a numeric equivalent for ambient turbidity, to adopt numeric criteria for diazinon, and to add mercury to the list of referenced conversion factors. DOEE is also proposing to update the groundwater standard and early warning values for arsenic, and proposing to correct the note for the detection limit, minimum level of quantitation, and the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) method for the silver ground water criterion.

The District's current turbidity criteria are twenty (20) Nephelometric Turbidity Units (NTU) above ambient for primary contact, secondary contact, and aquatic life designated uses. DOEE is not proposing to change the criteria; DOEE is, however, proposing a numeric equivalent for "ambient turbidity" to clarify the criteria. This rulemaking proposes two ambient equivalencies, one for District surface waters that are in the Piedmont ecoregion (that is, the Potomac River northwest of the Theodore Roosevelt Bridge and its tributaries, and Rock Creek) and the other one for District surface waters that are in the Coastal Plain ecoregion (that is, the Potomac River southeast of the Theodore Roosevelt Bridge and its tributaries and the Anacostia River and its tributaries).

The ambient equivalencies were calculated using twenty (20) years of turbidity data (over twenty thousand (20,000) samples taken from fifty (50) monitoring stations in District surface waters) and using established EPA methodology. The scientifically based methodology is used to determine ambient values that are protective of the primary contact and aquatic life designated uses, and is found in EPA's document entitled "Ambient Water Quality Criteria Recommendations: Information Supporting the Development of State and Tribal Nutrient Criteria: Rivers and Streams in Nutrient Ecoregion IX," EPA 822-B-00-019, https://www.epa.gov/sites/default/files/documents/rivers9.pdf, which was published in 2000.

Diazinon (CAS number 333415) is a broad-spectrum insecticide. Diazinon was used commonly

for household applications on lawns, ornamentals, and crack and crevice treatments before it was prohibited for residential use in 2004. DOEE is proposing to adopt EPA's recommended diazinon criteria. life ambient water quality EPA-822-R-05-006, aquatic https://www.epa.gov/sites/default/files/2019-03/documents/ambient-wqc-diazinon-final.pdf, of 0.3397 micrograms per liter ( $\mu$ g/L) as the freshwater acute criterion and 0.1699  $\mu$ g/L as the freshwater chronic criterion. Diazinon is not routinely found in the District; however, there is one pesticide registered in the District, corathon, that contains diazinon. There are no reported uses, sales, or hotspots of diazinon in the District. There are no EPA National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) individual permits that have diazinon permit limits. In addition, EPA strongly supports and encourages the adoption of this nationally recommended criteria.

DOEE is proposing to add mercury to the list of metals requiring an EPA conversion since the numeric criteria were established for total recoverable metals but are being used for dissolved metals. The failure to include mercury in the original table was an oversight that is being corrected here, per the EPA conversion factors specified in Appendix A of "EPA <u>National Recommended</u> <u>Water Quality Criteria: 2002</u>," EPA-822-R-02-047, November 2002, <u>https://nepis.epa.gov/Exe/ZyPDF.cgi/P1005EYQ.PDF?Dockey=P1005EYQ.PDF</u>.

Additionally, DOEE is proposing to update the District's Ground Water Standards (GWS). The District uses EPA's drinking water standards as a basis for the District's GWS because groundwater is protected as a raw drinking water source. GWS are used to protect groundwater for its beneficial uses, thereby minimizing harm to human and ecological receptors. DOEE is proposing to update the ground water quality standard for arsenic from 0.050 milligrams per liter (mg/L) to 0.010 mg/L and the early warning value from 0.01 mg/L to 0.002 mg/L (66 FR 6976 (https://www.federalregister.gov/documents/2001/07/19/01-18093/national-primary-drinking-water-regulations-arsenic-and-clarifications-to-compliance-and-new-source) and 40 CFR 141.62 (https://www.ecfr.gov/current/title-40/chapter-I/subchapter-D/part-141/subpart-G/section-141.62)). In 2001, EPA updated the 1993 arsenic criteria based on health benefits including reductions in the numbers of fatal and non-fatal lung and bladder cancers in a year and the costs of implementation by the regulated community (EPA, 2001, EPA 816-F-01-004 (https://nepis.epa.gov/Exe/ZyPDF.cgi?Dockey=300065YM.txt), and 2000b). There should be minimal costs to implement this change as sampling and treatment technologies to achieve the standard have been in use since EPA required them to be implemented by 2006.

DOEE is also proposing to correct the note for the silver ground water criterion by replacing it with the correct detection limit, minimum level of quantitation, and the EPA method.

Lastly, DOEE is making available the socio-economic, institutional, technological, and environmental (SITE) study which describes DOEE's rationale for proposing WQS updates and considers the impacts of applying and enforcing the updates, pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 8-103.04(c). The SITE study may be viewed at: https://doee.dc.gov/service/public-notices-hearings.

# Section 1105, IMPLEMENTATION AND APPLICABILITY, is amended as follows:

Subsection 1105.10 is amended to read as follows:

1105.10 The numerical criteria for dissolved cadmium, trivalent chromium, copper, lead, nickel, silver, and zinc shall be calculated by multiplying the criteria for these metals as specified in Table 2 of §1104.8 by the EPA Conversion Factors specified in Appendix A of the EPA <u>National Recommended Water Quality Criteria: 2002</u>, EPA-822-R-02-047, November 2002. This conversion is required to convert the metal criteria from total recoverable metals to dissolved metals.

#### NOTICE OF EMERGENCY AND PROPOSED RULEMAKING

The Interim Director of the Department of Health, pursuant to Section 302(14) of the District of Columbia Health Occupations Revision Act of 1985, effective March 25, 1986 (D.C. Law 6-99; D.C. Official Code § 3-1203.02(14)), and Mayor's Order 98-140, dated August 20, 1998, hereby gives notice of the adoption, on an emergency basis, of the following amendments to Section 6512 (Administration of Immunizations and Vaccinations by Pharmacists) of Chapter 65 (Pharmacists) of Title 17 (Business, Occupations, and Professionals) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations ("DCMR").

The Immunization of School Students Act of 1979, effective September 28, 1979 (D.C. Law 3-20; D.C. Official Code § 38-501 et seq.), requires all schools in the District of Columbia, including private, parochial, and independent schools, to verify student compliance with immunization requirements listed in 22-B DCMR § 129 as part of enrollment and attendance. Approximately 20% of students remain noncompliant with school-required vaccinations and would be subject to exclusion if not brought into compliance. Demand for vaccinations increases at the start of a new school year and into the fall, and often exceeds primary care capacity. Pursuant to the Third Amendment to Declaration Under the Public Readiness and Emergency Preparedness Act for Medical Countermeasures Against COVID-19, published August 24, 2020 (85 FR 52136), and the Public Readiness and Emergency Preparedness Act, approved December 30, 2005 (Pub. L. 109-148; 119 Stat. 2818) ("PREP Act"), pharmacists have been able to independently order and administer COVID-19, influenza, and routine pediatric immunizations to children age 3 and older. The ability of pharmacists to independently order and administer vaccinations, and to vaccinate children ages three (3) through eleven (11) has supported placedbased and school-located immunization opportunities outside of traditional primary care and pediatrician offices. Thus, pharmacists are a valued partner in maintaining ready access to routine pediatric immunization for children.

This rulemaking will permit pharmacists, who have been certified by the Board of Pharmacy to administer immunizations and vaccinations, to continue administering vaccinations that the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices ("ACIP") recommends to persons age three (3) years through eighteen (18) years, to any person age three (3) through seventeen (17) with parental consent according to ACIP's standard immunization schedule, after May 11, 2023 when the federal public health emergency ended. Without this rulemaking, pharmacists would only be able to vaccinate children age twelve (12) and older.

This rulemaking expands the patient age that pharmacists who have been certified by the Board of Pharmacy to administer immunizations and vaccinations can immunize from twelve (12) years and older to three (3) years and older with parental consent or valid identification if eighteen (18) or older, and allows pharmacy interns and pharmacy technicians to administer FDA authorized or FDA-licensed COVID-19 vaccines, or seasonal influenza vaccinations, under the pharmacist's direct supervision to an individual who is eighteen (18) years of age or older. Allowing pharmacists to administer vaccinations to children three (3) and older is consistent with the

immunization authority under which pharmacists have performed since 2021 under the PREP Act.

However, a written protocol and prescription or a standing order with a District of Columbialicensed physician will be required for pharmacists to administer vaccinations. The only exception to the written protocol and prescription or a standing order with a District of Columbia-licensed physician requirement will be COVID-19 vaccinations and seasonal influenza vaccinations, for which the federal Declaration Under the Public Readiness and Emergency Preparedness Act for Medical Countermeasures Against COVID-19 (85 FR 15198, Mar. 17, 2020), as amended, still preempts District law through December 31, 2024.

Emergency action is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health because it will protect the health of school-age children from vaccine-preventable diseases by facilitating convenient access to routine pediatric immunizations at neighborhood pharmacies, offering families more options with a larger range of available hours. This emergency rule was adopted by the Interim Director of DOH on June 22, 2023, and became effective immediately on that date. The emergency rule will remain in effect for one hundred twenty (120) days after the date of its effectiveness and expire on October 20, 2023, or upon publication of a Notice of Final Rulemaking in the *District of Columbia Register*, whichever occurs first.

The Interim Director also gives notice of the Interim Director's intent to take final rulemaking action to adopt this amendment in not less than thirty (30) days from the date of publication of this notice in the *District of Columbia Register*.

# Section 6512, ADMINISTRATION OF IMMUNIZATIONS AND VACCINATIONS BY PHARMACISTS, of Chapter 65, PHARMACISTS, of Title 17, BUSINESS, OCCUPATIONS, AND PROFESSIONALS, of the DCMR is amended as follows:

## Subsection 6512.5 is amended to read as follows:

- 6512.5 (a) Except as provided in paragraph (b), a pharmacist certified by the Board to administer immunizations and vaccinations shall only administer immunizations and vaccinations pursuant to:
  - (1) A written protocol signed and dated by a District of Columbia licensed physician authorizing the administration upon receipt of a written protocol; and
  - (2) (A) A valid prescription; or
    - (B) Physician standing order.
  - (b) The requirement for a written protocol and prescription or a standing order with a District of Columbia licensed physician shall not apply to FDAauthorized or FDA-licensed COVID-19 vaccines, or seasonal influenza vaccinations, until November 1, 2024, or until Sections V(f) and V(h) of

the Declaration Under the Public Readiness and Emergency Preparedness Act for Medical Countermeasures Against COVID-19 (85 FR 15198, Mar. 17, 2020), as amended, expire, whichever occurs later.

## Subsection 6512.7 is amended as follows:

# Paragraph (c) is amended as follows:

Subparagraph (5) is amended by striking the phrase "; and" and inserting "; or" in its place.

## Subparagraph (6) is amended to read as follows:

(6) Any person aged three (3) and older with parental consent, or valid identification if eighteen (18) or older, for any vaccination that the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices ("ACIP") recommends according to ACIP's standard immunization schedule;

## Subsections 6512.9 and 6512.10 are amended to read as follows:

- 6512.9 Except as provided in § 6512.10, a pharmacist certified by the Board of Pharmacy to administer immunizations and vaccinations shall not administer an immunization or vaccination to any individual younger than three (3) years old.
- 6512.10 A pharmacist certified by the Board of Pharmacy to administer immunizations and vaccinations shall only administer an immunization or vaccination to an individual under the age of three (3) upon a referral from a physician who has an established physician-patient relationship with the patient.

## Subsection 6512.12 is amended to read as follows:

A pharmacist certified to administer immunizations and vaccinations may permit a registered pharmacy intern or registered pharmacy technician to administer FDA-authorized or FDA-licensed COVID-19 vaccines, or seasonal influenza vaccinations, under the pharmacist's direct supervision to an individual who is eighteen (18) years of age or older; provided, that the registered pharmacy intern or registered pharmacy technician has successfully completed a Board of Pharmacy-approved ACPE-approved course meeting the requirements of § 6512.2(b)(3).

#### **NOTICE OF EMERGENCY AND PROPOSED RULEMAKING**

The Executive Director of the Office of Lottery and Gaming (Office), pursuant to the authority set forth in Section 4 of the Law to Legalize Lotteries, Daily Numbers Games, and Bingo and Raffles for Charitable Purposes in the District of Columbia, effective March 10, 1981 (D.C. Law 3-172; D.C. Official Code §§ 36-601.06(a), 36-621.02, and 36-621.11 (2016 Repl.)), and Office of the Chief Financial Officer Management Control Order No. 21-08, effective August 30, 2021, hereby gives notice of the following emergency amendments to Chapter 20 (District Operated Sports Wagering) of Title 30 (Lottery and Charitable Games) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (DCMR).

The emergency rulemaking gives the Office authority to place limits on a person's sports wagering activities at retailer locations in order to curb excessive sports wagering and ensure responsible play by individuals at retail locations.

The Executive Director has determined that emergency rulemaking action, pursuant to Section 6(c) of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, approved October 21, 1968 (82 Stat. 1206, D.C. Official Code § 2-505(c)), is necessary for the welfare of District of Columbia residents. Emergency action is necessary to promote the immediate preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of District residents.

These emergency rules were adopted by the Executive Director on June 29, 2023, took effect immediately, and will remain in effect for up to one hundred twenty (120) days from adoption, expiring October 27, 2023.

The Executive Director also gives notice of intent to take final rulemaking action to adopt these amendments in not less than thirty (30) days from the date of publication of this notice in the *District of Columbia Register*.

#### 2023 RETAIL SPORTS WAGERING PROGRAM

- All sports wagering advertising must be pre-approved by the Office.
- 2023.2 The use of sports wagering kiosks is restricted to individuals eighteen (18) years of age and older.
- 2023.3 Sports wagering kiosks shall only accept United States currency.
- The maximum wager amount for a single wager shall be one thousand dollars (\$1,000).
- 2023.5 No more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) can be inserted into the terminal without placing a wager.
- 2023.6 A Lottery Sports Wagering Sales Agent shall not allow anyone to access sports wagering self-service terminal keys, open sports wagering self-service terminal cabinet doors, or access sports wagering self-service terminal internal

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components except for the sales agent, an employee of the sales agent, an Office employee, or the employee of an Office contractor.

- 2023.7 In order to curb excessive wagering and ensure responsible play at retail locations, the Office may place limits on a person's sports wagering activities based upon the following criteria:
  - (a) The amount of time a person spends wagering at a retail location or locations; or
  - (b) The amount of money a person wagers at a retail location or locations; or
  - (c) The number of wagers placed by a person in a short period of time at a retail location or locations.
- 2023.8 The Office shall not pay winnings to a person if it is determined by the Office that the person violated the wagering limits imposed by the Office and all such winnings shall be forfeited.
- A person may be placed on the Office's Involuntary Exclusion List if the person violates any wagering limits established by the Office.
- A Lottery Sports Wagering Sales Agent is prohibited from knowingly allowing a person to violate any wagering limits established by the Office.
- 2023.11 A Lottery Sports Wagering Sales Agent may only conduct sports wagering activities during hours preapproved by the Office. Lottery Sports Wagering Sales Agents that were licensed prior to the effective date of this rule shall have ninety days from the effective date of this rule to have their sports wagering business hours approved by the Office.
- 2023.12 Winning tickets of six hundred dollars (\$600) or less can be used to place wagers up to the value of the winning ticket at a sports wagering kiosk.
- 2023.13 Winning tickets with a value of six hundred dollars (\$600) or less can be redeemed at any Lottery Sports Wagering Sales Agent location or at the Office's Prize Center.
- All winning tickets over six hundred dollars (\$600) must be claimed at the Office's Prize Center.
- 2023.15 The Office's Prize Center does not issue cash payments. All payments at the Office's Prize Center shall be made by check or electronic transfer.
- 2023.16 To claim a prize at the Office's Prize Center, a player shall present a valid government issued driver's license or non-driver identification card and proof of their tax identification number. A player shall also present any other identification required by the Office.

2023.17 Prize claims are subject to the provisions contained in Chapters 5 and 6 of this title.

  - c. On Wednesday, July 19, 2023, commencing at 10:00 a.m. and continuing until 8:30 p.m., the 1100 block of 21st Place, NE;
  - d. On Friday, July 21, 2023, commencing at 10:00 a.m. and continuing until 8:30 p.m., the 600 block of O Street, NW,;
  - e. On Wednesday, July 26, 2023, commencing at 10:00 a.m. and continuing until 8:30 p.m., the 1400 block of Saratoga Avenue, NE;
  - f. On Friday, July 28, 2023, commencing at 10:00 a.m. and continuing until 8:30 p.m., the 1200 block of I Street, NE;
  - g. On Thursday, August 3, 2023, commencing at 10:00 a.m. and continuing until 8:30 p.m., the 900 block of Taylor Street, NW;
  - h. On Wednesday, August 9, 2023, commencing at 10:00 a.m. and continuing until 8:30 p.m., the 100 block of Atlantic Street, SE;

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- i. On Wednesday, August 16, 2023, commencing at 10:00 a.m. and continuing until 8:30 p.m., the 5200 block of Foote Street, NE; and
- j. On Friday, August 18, 2023, commencing at 10:00 a.m. and continuing until 8:30 p.m., the 1300 block of Congress Street, SE.
- 2. All vehicles shall be removed from the streets designated in paragraph 1 of this Order no later than 8:00 a.m. on the dates designated in paragraph 1 of this Order.
- 3. The Special Event Areas designated by this Order shall be operated and overseen by the Metropolitan Police Department.
- 4. This Order is authorization for the use of the designated streets and curb lanes only, and the operating entities shall secure and maintain all other licenses and permits applicable to the activities associated with the operation of the events. All building, health, life safety, and use of public space requirements shall remain applicable to the Special Event Areas designated by this Order.

 Conduct education and outreach to domestic workers, hiring entities, and the public about the rights of domestic workers.

**Estimated Available Funds:** Through this Notice of Funding Availability, OAG plans to fund two initiatives:

- 1. <u>Education and Outreach</u>: OAG will make up to \$180,000 available to conduct education and outreach to domestic workers, hiring entities, and the public about the rights of domestic workers.
- 2. <u>Hazard Guidance</u>: OAG will make up to \$80,000 available to develop guidance to address the most common hazards domestic workers encounter in their workplaces and how to mitigate them.

OAG will make up to \$50,000 in funding available per grant award and grant initiative, with no more than \$100,000 awarded per organization for Fiscal Year 2024. Funding limits for each initiative were determined with guidance received from the Council of the District of Columbia.

# PUBLIC NOTICE OF *MY LIFE, MY WAY* PROGRAM BUDGET FORMULATION

#### Home and Community-Based Services Waiver for Individual and Family Support

The Director of the Department of Health Care Finance (DHCF), pursuant to the authority set forth in an Act to enable the District of Columbia to receive federal financial assistance under Title XIX of the Social Security Act for a medical assistance program, and for other purposes, approved December 27, 1967 (81 Stat. 744; D.C. Official Code § 1-307.02) (2016 Repl. & 2022 Supp.)), and Section 6(6) of the Department of Health Care Finance Establishment Act of 2007, effective February 27, 2008 (D.C. Law 17-109; D.C. Official Code § 7-771.05(6) (2018 Repl. & 2002 Supp.)), hereby gives notice, in accordance with Section 11113.2(d) of Title 29 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (DCMR), of the pre-determined percentage by which *My Life, My Way* participants' budgets will be reduced during the participant-directed services budget formulation process.

On June 23, 2023, DHCF published Notice of Final Rulemaking at 70 D.C. Reg. 008909-008950 for the Medicaid participant-directed *My Life, My Way* program in 29 DCMR Chapter 111, which is offered under the Medicaid Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) Waiver for Individual and Family Support (IFS). The IFS HCBS waiver is operated by the Department on Disability Services (DDS) under DHCF's supervision in accordance with 29 DCMR § 9000.3.

Section 11113.2 of Title 29 of the DCMR describes the *My Life, My Way* program budget methodology. In accordance with Section 11113.2 of Title 29 of the DCMR, the *My Life, My Way* program budget shall be developed based on the following methodology:

- (a) The participant's total assessed hours per week for companion, individualized day supports, and/or in-home supports services in accordance with service limitations set forth in 29 DCMR §§ 9017.16, 9024.23, and 9025.19, is converted to hours per month; and/or
- (b) For respite services the participant's total assessed days per ISP year in accordance with service limitations set forth in 29 DCMR § 9030.17; and
- (c) The total number of service hours per month is multiplied by the hourly or daily rate paid by DHCF for services; and
- (d) The total amount computed in (c) above is reduced by a pre-determined percentage to reflect the lower overhead and administrative costs associated with the *My Life, My Way* Program.

Effective, August 7, 2023, the pre-determined percentage identified in 29 DCMR § 11113.2(d) is five percent (5%). As of August 7, 2023, if a budget is submitted by a Support Broker and is not reduced by five percent (5%) during the budget formulation process, DDS will return the budget to the *My Life, My Way* participant so that the budget can be amended to comply with 29 DCMR § 11113.2.

This 2023-2024 Maximum Income, Rent and Purchase Price Schedule is published pursuant to the Inclusionary Zoning Implementation Amendment Act of 2006, effective March 14, 2007 (D.C. Law 16-275; D.C. Official Code § 6-1041.01 *et seq.*, as amended) and the Inclusionary Zoning Regulations codified in Chapter 10 of Title 11-C and Chapter 22 of Title 14 of the DCMR. This schedule is effective upon publication in the D.C. Register.

Maximum Annual Income<sup>1</sup> limits, Minimum Annual Income limits<sup>2</sup>, housing costs and purchase prices are based on the Washington Metropolitan Statistical Area Median Family Income (MFI), previously referred to as Area Median Income (AMI). The MFI for a household of 4, as published by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) on May 15, 2023, is \$152,100. The limits are adjusted for household size in this schedule.

Inclusionary Zoning (IZ) units currently exist only at the 50%, 60%, and 80% MFI levels. However, this schedule also includes the 30%, 100%, and 120% MFI maximum and minimum income levels and maximum housing cost and purchase price amounts, which are often used in residential developments that include Affordable Dwelling Units (ADUs). For ADUs that are subject to Affordable Housing Covenants that include specific formulas for calculating income limits, housing costs or rents, and purchase prices, all figures provided here are for guidance only. Individuals must consult the particular affordability requirements imposed by the terms of the applicable Affordable Housing Covenants to determine the requirements applicable to the subject ADU.

The Maximum Purchase Price or Maximum Housing Costs are calculated based on a Household at the benchmark income spending no more than 30% of its income toward housing costs.

The 2023 MFI represents a 6.89% increase over the prior year MFI for the region (\$142,300). Historically, the MFI has often varied significantly from year to year, declining and increasing due to statistical and economic factors. To facilitate the operation of the program and the planning of housing providers and residents alike, starting in 2018, Maximum Housing Costs and Maximum Purchase Prices have been limited to a 3% change over the prior year. Since 2018, the MFI has typically increased by more than 3%, so the Maximum Housing Costs and Maximum Purchase Price increases have been limited to 3% over prior years. The latest increase in MFI again limits increases in Maximum Housing Costs and Maximum Purchase Prices to 3% increases over the prior year.

Maximum Allowable Rent is equal to the Maximum Housing Costs published in the above tables minus any utility expenses paid by the tenant for water, sewer, electricity, natural gas, (see Schedule 1, last page of this document) trash, and any other fees required in order to occupy the unit, including, but not limited to, mandatory amenity fees or administrative fees. An owner of an IZ unit or ADU may lower the rents or prices below the maximum rates identified in the tables to achieve a larger marketing band of incomes to assure occupancy.

Maximum Purchase Prices are calculated using the following assumptions:

- A conventional 30 year, fixed-rate, fully amortizing mortgage at the national average mortgage rate as published by Freddie Mac at <u>https://www.freddiemac.com/pmms</u> (6.35% as of May 18, 2023 and in place at the time the HUD MFI was announced) plus a 0.5% cushion to protect for future interest rate increases and a 5% down payment. We are using the Freddie Mac Primary Mortgage Market Survey (PMMS) data and we are using a 0.5% cushion instead of the typical 1.5% cushion due to the current relatively high interest rates.
- 2. Real estate property taxes are assessed based on the control price at the current real estate tax rate of \$0.85 per \$100 of valuation and a homestead deduction of \$84,000.
- 3. Condominium fees are estimated at \$0.79 per square foot per month applied to the assumed unit square footages. Single-Family homeowner association fees are estimated at \$0.13 per square foot per month applied to the assumed unit square footages. Estimated unit sizes are:

#### Schedule 1: Estimated Utilities By Unit Type

The following utility estimates are produced by the District of Columbia Housing Authority (2016 figures retained for this price schedule). The estimates shall be deducted from the Maximum Housing Costs if the tenant pays all or a portion of the required utilities. Only those utilities for which the tenant is responsible shall be deducted from the Maximum Housing Costs. For example, an 80% MFI one-bedroom all-electric apartment for which the tenant pays electricity, but not water and sewer charges, will have a maximum rent of \$1,790 (\$1,970 Maximum Housing Cost minus \$180 estimated electricity cost).

Required fees are also deducted from the Maximum Housing Cost. If this same property also charges a \$500/year amenity fee, the pro-rated amount of \$42/month would also be deducted from the Maximum Housing Cost, yielding a Maximum Allowable Rent of \$1,748.

#### C. Target Population:

The target population for these funds are members of the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Questioning community of all ages who reside in the District of Columbia, regardless of their immigration status.

### **D. Eligibility Criteria**

Applicants shall meet the following conditions to apply for the FY24 LGBTQIA+ Community Development Grant:

1. The organization is a CBO with a Federal 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status or evidence of fiscal agent relationship with a 501(c)(3) organization; or be a private entity, such as a coalition or association, that is partnering with at least one or more 501(c)(3) organization(s);

2. The organization's principal place of business must be located in the District of Columbia; if a national or regional organization, it must have a location in the District through which it provides services;

3. The organization must provide services to DC residents or collaborate with an organization that provides services to DC residents through the organizational efforts of the applicant;

4. The organization must be currently registered in good standing with the DC Department of Licensing and Consumer Protection (DLCP), and the Office of Tax and Revenue (OTR);

5. All services and programming funded by the grant must be provided in the District of Columbia; and

6. (This requirement applies only to current MOLGBTQA grantees) Current grantees must be current on MOLGBTQA reporting obligations for the FY23 grant cycle, must be in good standing with the District's legal requirements, including those imposed by grant contracts, and progress reports must reflect substantial progress towards the goals of their grant agreement.

#### **DECISION AND ORDER**

#### I. Statement of the Case

On March 3, 2023, Johnny Norris (Grievant) timely filed an arbitration review request (Request) pursuant to the Comprehensive Merit Personnel Act (CMPA)<sup>1</sup> seeking review of a February 13, 2023, arbitration award (Award).<sup>2</sup> In the Award, the Arbitrator denied a grievance that the Fraternal Order of Police/Metropolitan Police Department Labor Committee (FOP) filed on the Grievant's behalf and upheld the decision of the District of Columbia Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) to terminate the Grievant, an MPD officer.<sup>3</sup> FOP now argues that the Award is contrary to law and public policy.<sup>4</sup>

Upon consideration of the Arbitrator's conclusions, applicable law, and the record presented by the parties, the Board concludes that the Award is not contrary to law and public policy. Therefore, the arbitration review request is denied.

#### II. Arbitration Award

#### A. Background

The Arbitrator made the following factual findings. The Grievant began his career as an MPD officer approximately four and a half years before the May 23, 2021, incident that led to his termination.<sup>5</sup> At approximately 7:30 p.m. on the evening of the incident, the Grievant and his female friend arrived at a bar located in Falls Church, Virginia.<sup>6</sup> They spent several hours drinking.<sup>7</sup> One of the Grievant's male friends eventually joined them.<sup>8</sup> The Grievant later testified to MPD's Internal Affairs Division (IAD) that he consumed three or four alcoholic beverages while at the bar.<sup>9</sup> However, the group's receipt from the bar showed they purchased a total of thirty-four drinks.<sup>10</sup>

At approximately 11:55 p.m., the Grievant's female friend left the bar and drove away in her vehicle.<sup>11</sup> The Grievant and his male friend left the bar a few minutes later in separate vehicles.<sup>12</sup> Shortly thereafter, the Grievant's female friend crashed her car into a telephone pole in Alexandria Virginia, causing an explosion and a power outage in the area.<sup>13</sup> She was uninjured, but the airbag deployed, and her vehicle was damaged.<sup>14</sup> She immediately called the Grievant.<sup>15</sup>

Officers from the Fairfax Country Police Department (FCPD), Arlington County Police Department (ACPD), and Alexandria City Police Department (APD) (collectively, "Virginia officers") arrived at the scene and approached the Grievant's female friend to investigate her for driving while intoxicated (DWI).<sup>16</sup> They heard her on the phone with the Grievant, asking him to come to the site of the accident so the police officers would let her go.<sup>17</sup> Officers from FCPD and APD spoke to the Grievant on his female friend's phone, and the Grievant advised them that he was on his way to the scene.<sup>18</sup>

The Grievant arrived at the scene of the accident.<sup>19</sup> He loudly announced his presence and identified himself as an MPD officer.<sup>20</sup> The surrounding Virginia officers later testified that they observed the Grievant "swaying, slurring his speech, and smelling of alcohol, all signs of

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intoxication."<sup>21</sup> The APD officer who had spoken to the Grievant over the phone greeted him and explained that a DWI investigation was underway.<sup>22</sup> The Grievant was in plain clothes and the APD officer inquired whether the Grievant was really a police officer.<sup>23</sup> The Grievant cursed at the APD officer and produced his MPD badge.<sup>24</sup> The APD officer attempted to take the badge from the Grievant's hand for further inspection, but the Grievant would not permit him to hold it.<sup>25</sup> The APD officer later testified that the Grievant's demeanor shifted in that moment, becoming aggressive.<sup>26</sup>

The Grievant referenced his experience investigating car accidents in D.C. and challenged the APD officer's assessment of the situation, suggesting that perhaps a different vehicle was at fault for the accident.<sup>27</sup> The Grievant "tapped [the APD officer's] chest repeatedly with his right hand, making contact at least five times in a matter of seconds."<sup>28</sup> The APD officer advised the Grievant not to touch him.<sup>29</sup> The Grievant commented to one of the FCPD officers that he did not want to speak to the APD officer for fear of becoming angry and "get[ting] locked up for knocking him out."<sup>30</sup> The APD officer told the Grievant that he was observably intoxicated and advised him to leave or risk being arrested.<sup>31</sup> The APD officer turned away from the Grievant and gave him the opportunity to depart, but the Grievant explicitly refused to leave.<sup>32</sup> The FCPD officer told the Grievant that he was interfering with the DWI investigation and unnecessarily risking his MPD job.<sup>33</sup> The Grievant ignored this advice and asked the Virginia officers whether they understood how to properly evaluate a field sobriety test and whether they had video footage of the crash.<sup>34</sup>

The Grievant's male friend arrived at the scene, briefly spoke with the FCPD officer, and "eventually escorted the [Grievant] away from the immediate area of the investigation."<sup>35</sup> The FCPD officer advised his colleague that they must keep the Grievant from driving off in his vehicle because "they would be liable if something happened."<sup>36</sup>

The Virginia officers administered sobriety and breathalyzer tests to the Grievant's female friend before arresting her for a DWI.<sup>37</sup> As they prepared to leave the crash site, the Virginia

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officers received a call about a possible fight in the vicinity and heard yelling from a hotel parking lot across the street.<sup>38</sup> Upon inspection, they observed that the Grievant and his male friend were "involved in what appeared to be a physical and verbal altercation with one another."<sup>39</sup>

An APD officer approached the men and inquired as to their wellbeing.<sup>40</sup> The Grievant responded by yelling obscenities and disparaging the APD.<sup>41</sup> An FCPD officer observed the Grievant's male friend attempting to guide the Grievant into the passenger seat of his car.<sup>42</sup> The FCPD officer asked the Grievant's friend whether everything was resolved, and the Grievant cursed at him and shouted a racial slur.<sup>43</sup> The Grievant's friend apologized on his behalf.<sup>44</sup> The FCPD officer suggested that the two men use a ride-share service, as the Grievant's friend also showed signs of intoxication.<sup>45</sup>

The Grievant's friend called a ride-share service.<sup>46</sup> As they waited for their ride, the Grievant continued to yell at the Virginia officers while his friend restrained him.<sup>47</sup> The Virginia officers later testified that he shouted more racial expletives at them and threatened to physically harm them.<sup>48</sup> The APD officer testified that the Grievant was "angry and aggressive," threatening that if the APD officer came to D.C., the MPD officers would not treat him well.<sup>49</sup> The APD officer testified that he had probable cause at that time to arrest the Grievant for "disorderly conduct" and being "drunk in public."50

At approximately 2 a.m. on the night of the incident, an APD officer informed MPD's Internal Affairs Division (IAD) of the Grievant's conduct.<sup>51</sup> On May 24, 2021, IAD generated an Incident Summary number for the matter.<sup>52</sup> IAD conducted further investigation and sustained the allegations against the Grievant.<sup>53</sup> On September 29, 2021, MPD's Disciplinary Review Division served the Grievant with a Notice of Proposed Adverse Action (Notice).<sup>54</sup> The Notice set forth five administrative charges, each with one or more specifications.<sup>55</sup> The charges were as follows-Charge No. 1: being under the influence of alcohol while off duty; Charge No. 2: failing to obey orders or directives issued by the Chief of Police concerning the proper conduct for MPD officers;

Charge No. 3: engaging in conduct prejudicial to the police force; Charge No. 4: engaging in conduct unbecoming an officer; and Charge No. 5: being involved in the commission of an act which would constitute a crime, with or without a conviction.<sup>56</sup> The Notice included an analysis of the *Douglas*<sup>57</sup> factors to support MPD's conclusion that termination was the only appropriate penalty for the Grievant's actions.<sup>58</sup>

The Grievant requested an administrative action hearing (Hearing) which convened on September 29, 2021, March 4, 2022, and March 7, 2022.<sup>59</sup> The Grievant pled "Not Guilty" to all the charges and specifications except Charge No. 2, Specification No. 1, to which he pled "Guilty with Explanation."<sup>60</sup> The Adverse Action Panel (Panel) found the Grievant guilty of all charges and specifications except Charge No. 3, Specification No. 1.<sup>61</sup> The Panel recommended termination for Charge No. 5, Specification No. 1.<sup>62</sup> Accordingly, on March 25, 2023, MPD issued a Final Notice of Adverse Action (Final Notice), informing the Grievant that he would be terminated on April 11, 2022.<sup>63</sup> FOP appealed the determination on the Grievant's behalf, but the Chief of Police denied the appeal.<sup>64</sup> The Grievant's termination was effectuated on May 9, 2022.<sup>65</sup> FOP invoked arbitration.<sup>66</sup>

# **B.** Arbitrator's Findings

The parties submitted the following issues to the Arbitrator for consideration:

- (1) Whether there was sufficient evidence to sustain the charges against [the Grievant]?
- (2) Whether termination is an appropriate penalty?<sup>67</sup>

The Arbitrator established that his authority stemmed solely from the parties' collective bargaining agreement (CBA) and thus, the underlying issue was whether the adverse action MPD

imposed on the Grievant was consistent with the CBA requirement that "discipline may be imposed only for cause, as authorized in D.C. Official Code § 616.51."<sup>68</sup>

At Arbitration, MPD cited *Stokes v. D.C.*<sup>69</sup> for the proposition that an "agency['s] decision should not be set aside if it is supported by substantial evidence in the record as a whole and not clearly erroneous as a matter of law."<sup>70</sup> The Arbitrator dismissed this argument, finding that *Stokes* does not provide a mandatory standard of review in situations where the parties select an arbitrator in accordance with a CBA for the purposes of determining whether a disciplinary decision is for cause.<sup>71</sup> The Arbitrator found that an arbitrator has wide discretion to overturn an adverse action and/or the resulting penalties, subject only to the limitations contained in the parties' CBA.<sup>72</sup> The Arbitrator determined that MPD was subject to a preponderance of the evidence standard.<sup>73</sup> Faced with contradictory narratives concerning the events of this case, the Arbitrator principally relied on body worn camera (BWC) footage, the Grievant's testimony, and sworn testimony from the Virginia officers to establish an evidentiary record.<sup>74</sup>

The Arbitrator's analysis focused on the merits of Charge No. 5 because that was the charge for which MPD terminated the Grievant.<sup>75</sup> Charge No. 5 asserted that the Grievant violated MPD General Order Series 120.21, Attachment A, Part A-7 through his involvement in the commission of an act which would constitute a crime, regardless of the fact that he was not convicted.<sup>76</sup> The sole Specification under that Charge stated that multiple Virginia officers indicated they had probable cause to arrest the Grievant for violations of Virginia Criminal Code (VCC) § 18.2-388 (intoxication in public); § 18.2-415 (disorderly conduct in public places); § 18.2-57 (assault and battery against a law enforcement officer); and § 18.2-460 (obstructing justice).<sup>77</sup>

Regarding the first of these crimes, "intoxication in public," the Arbitrator found that the Grievant's actions indisputably occurred in a public place.<sup>78</sup> Thus, the Arbitrator examined the evidence demonstrating the Grievant's intoxication.<sup>79</sup> At the Hearing, the Grievant testified that "he was inebriated and impaired by alcohol" and BWC footage captured his [male] friend's statement that he was drunk.<sup>80</sup> Additionally, several Virginia officers testified that he displayed "various signs of intoxication at the accident scene and in the [hotel] parking lot."<sup>81</sup> The Arbitrator

dismissed FOP's argument that there was no chemical evidence of the Grievant's intoxication, finding that VCC § 18.2-388 only requires the observable indicators of intoxication, which the Virginia officers testified the Grievant displayed.<sup>82</sup> The Arbitrator concluded that MPD proved the Grievant's intoxication by a preponderance of the evidence and had probable cause to arrest the Grievant for violating VCC § 18.2-388.

The Arbitrator addressed the Panel's conclusion that the Grievant violated VCC § 18.2-415(a)(1) by engaging in disorderly conduct in a public space. Under that provision, guilt is established where a person "while in a public place engages in conduct having a direct tendency to cause acts of violence by the person or persons at whom, individually, such conduct is directed."<sup>83</sup> The Arbitrator determined that "a violation occurs if an officer reasonably feels that he or she [i]s going to have to fight to subdue the person."<sup>84</sup> The Arbitrator observed that "there is no requirement that an officer must have the immediate *impression* of a pending fight, or that a person's behavior must be *assaultive*, to be charged with a violation of § 18.2-415."<sup>85</sup> The Arbitrator found that the Panel properly concluded that the Grievant violated 18.2-415(a)(1) based on testimony from the Virginia officers, as well as the Grievant's admission at the Hearing that his verbal threats "could have placed someone in fear."<sup>86</sup> The Arbitrator addressed FOP's argument that "the [Panel] failed to identify the specific disorderly conduct the [Grievant] engaged in," thus failing to demonstrate that he violated VCC § 18.2-415(a)(1).<sup>87</sup> The Arbitrator determined that FOP's contention was unpersuasive because substantial evidence demonstrated that the Grievant "was involved in the commission of acts that would constitute a violation of § 18.2-415."\*88

The Arbitrator discussed the Panel's conclusion that the Grievant violated VCC § 18.2-57 by committing assault and battery against a law enforcement officer.<sup>89</sup> The Arbitrator found that "a violation of VCC § 18.2-57 for common law tortious *assault* occurs if it can be proven that: (1) a person engaged in an overt act intended to place the victim in fear or apprehension of bodily harm; and (2) the act creates reasonable fear or apprehension in the victim."<sup>90</sup> The Arbitrator found that BWC footage clearly shows the Grievant "making repeated, albeit relatively light and rapid" contact with an APD officer's chest, followed by that officer objecting to the contact.<sup>91</sup> FOP argued that the Grievant did not possess the necessary intent to inflict bodily harm or place the APD officer in fear of bodily harm.<sup>92</sup> However, the Arbitrator found that unlawful intent may be imputed from willful touching which is "rude, insolent, or angry" and can be "gathered from

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the conduct of the aggressor, viewed in light of the attending circumstances."<sup>93</sup> The Arbitrator considered the circumstances of this case, and concluded that substantial evidence showed the Grievant violated § 18.2-57.<sup>94</sup>

Lastly, the Arbitrator discussed the Panel's determination that the Grievant violated VCC § 18.2-460 by obstructing justice.<sup>95</sup> The Arbitrator determined that this charge required proof that the Grievant "knowingly, and without just cause, obstructed a law-enforcement officer in the performance of his duties, or failed or refused to cease such obstruction when required to do so by a law-enforcement officer."<sup>96</sup> The Arbitrator considered BWC footage from the accident scene, which documented Virginia officers repeatedly ordering the Grievant to leave and the Grievant's refusal to comply.<sup>97</sup> The Arbitrator also considered an APD officer's testimony that the Grievant's behavior impeded the investigation.<sup>98</sup> The Arbitrator addressed FOP's argument that the Panel's guilty finding for this charge was unreasonable, given that the Panel found the Grievant's act of gathering information at the scene did not violate MPD policy.<sup>99</sup> The Arbitrator dismissed FOP's contention, concluding there was a marked difference between merely gathering information and disrupting an investigation.<sup>100</sup> The Arbitrator concluded that substantial evidence showed the Grievant violated § 18.2-460.

The Arbitrator proceeded to conduct an independent review of the *Douglas* factors to determine whether the Panel imposed an appropriate penalty for the Grievant's misconduct.<sup>101</sup> The Arbitrator agreed with the Panel's assessment with respect to all but two of the twelve factors.<sup>102</sup> In sum, the Arbitrator found that "seven of the factors [we]re aggravating, including the most important one, *Douglas* Factor No. 1,<sup>103</sup> four [we]re neutral, and only one, *Douglas* Factor No. 4, [wa]s mitigating."<sup>104</sup>

Therefore, the Arbitrator found that there was no basis to disturb the penalty.<sup>105</sup>

#### III. Discussion

As a preliminary matter, FOP challenges the Arbitrator's assessment of the facts. FOP offers a factual narrative which characterizes the Grievant's actions in a more favorable light than the Award, asserting that the Arbitrator unjustly "order[ed] [the Grievant] to be terminated for merely engaging in an argument."<sup>106</sup> The Board does not act as a finder of fact, nor does it substitute its judgment for that of the arbitrator on credibility determinations and the weight attributed to evidence.<sup>107</sup> Thus, the Board will not disturb the factual record which the Arbitrator established, nor question the weight the Arbitrator assigned to the available evidence.

Section 1-605.02(6) of the D.C. Official Code permits the Board to modify, set aside, or remand a grievance arbitration award in three narrow circumstances: (1) if an arbitrator was without, or exceeded his or her jurisdiction; (2) if the award on its face is contrary to law and public policy; or (3) if the award was procured by fraud, collusion or other similar and unlawful means. FOP requests review of the Award on the grounds that the Award is contrary to law and public policy.<sup>108</sup>

## A. The Award is not contrary to law.

To set aside an award as contrary to law, the asserting party bears the burden to present applicable law that mandates that the arbitrator arrive at a different result.<sup>109</sup> Further, the asserting party has the burden to demonstrate that the award itself violates established law or compels an explicit violation of "well defined public policy grounded in law and or legal precedent."<sup>110</sup> The violation must be so significant that law and public policy mandate a different result.<sup>111</sup>

FOP argues that "the Arbitrator *ignored* the law when he issued [the Award]."<sup>112</sup> FOP's assertion is inaccurate, as the Arbitrator provided detailed analyses concerning each of the four statutory provisions governing the criminal offenses listed under Charge No. 5, Specification No. 1.<sup>113</sup> FOP argues that the Award violated those statutory provisions.<sup>114</sup> This argument is unavailing because it amounts to disagreement with the Arbitrator's statutory interpretation. The Board will not substitute its own legal interpretation for that of the Arbitrator. The Board has held that where, as here, the parties specifically bargained for the Arbitrator's interpretation of the

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agreement, the parties have implicitly bargained for the Arbitrator's interpretation of the applicable law and related regulations.<sup>115</sup>

No further discussion is necessary regarding the first three criminal offenses listed under Charge No. 5, Specification No. 1 (VCC § 18.2-388 (intoxication in public); § 18.2-415 (disorderly conduct in public places); and § 18.2-57 (assault and battery against a law enforcement officer)).<sup>116</sup> However, FOP's argument concerning VCC § 18.2-460 (obstructing justice) warrants further attention. FOP asserts that the Arbitrator violated VCC § 18.2-460 by approving the Panel's recommended termination for Charge No. 5, Specification No 1., while also accepting the Panel's finding that the Grievant acted within his rights when he initially approached and questioned the Virginia officers and thus, he was not guilty of Charge No. 3, Specification No. 1 (prejudicial conduct).<sup>117</sup>

The Court of Appeals of Virginia has drawn a distinction between merely questioning a police officer and verbally engaging a police officer in a manner that obstructs justice under VCC § 18.2-460. The matter of *Molinet v. Commonwealth*<sup>118</sup> provides an example of an individual who crossed the line from lawfully questioning the police to obstructing justice. In *Molinet*, the appellant initiated a conversation with a police officer who was investigating a public fight, purportedly intervening out of concern for the individuals involved.<sup>119</sup> The officer was occupied with controlling the scene and ensuring the safety of those present, and repeatedly asked the appellant to leave.<sup>120</sup> However, the appellant refused, displaying threatening body language and directing profanities and insults at the officer.<sup>121</sup> The appellant was placed under arrest and was charged and convicted of obstruction of justice.<sup>122</sup> The Court of Appeals of Virginia upheld the conviction, finding that "a rational factfinder could have found that [the] appellant's conduct prevented [the officer] from performing his duties," in violation of VCC § 18.2-460.<sup>123</sup>

Consistent with the court's holding in *Molinet*, the Arbitrator upheld the Panel's determination that the Grievant's initial insertion of himself into the investigation did not amount to prejudicial conduct, but his subsequent behavior constituted an obstruction of justice. FOP has not met its burden to present applicable law that the Award violates on its face. Therefore, the Board finds that the Award is not contrary to law.

# **B.** The Award is not contrary to public policy.

The Board's scope of review is particularly narrow concerning the public policy exception.<sup>124</sup> A grievant is required to first identify a public policy that "must be well defined and dominant," and ascertained from "reference to the laws and legal precedents and not from general considerations of supposed public interests."<sup>125</sup> Once a well-defined public policy is identified, the Grievant must demonstrate that the arbitration award "compels" the violation of this explicit, well defined public policy.<sup>126</sup> The D.C. Court of Appeals has noted that the issue is not whether the employee's misconduct violated public policy but rather whether enforcing the arbitral award would do so.<sup>127</sup>

FOP argues that the Award "flies in the face of both the public policy underlying the laws of the Virginia legislature and the required *mens rea* element for deeming [the Grievant] guilty" of violating VCC § 18.2-57 (assault and battery involving a law enforcement officer).<sup>128</sup> FOP does not identify an "explicit, well defined" public policy, let alone demonstrate that such a policy compels reversal of the Award.

For these reasons, the Board finds that the Award is not contrary to public policy.

# IV. Conclusion

For the reasons stated, the Board rejects FOP's arguments and finds no cause to modify, set aside, or remand the Award. Accordingly, FOP's Request is denied, and the matter is dismissed in its entirety.

# **DECISION AND ORDER**

## I. Statement of the Case

On April 24, 2023, the District of Columbia Public Schools (DCPS) filed an arbitration review request (Request) pursuant to the Comprehensive Merit Personnel Act (CMPA) seeking review of an arbitration award (Award) dated March 31, 2023.<sup>1</sup> The parties stipulated that DCPS improperly terminated the Grievant as an employee and limited the scope of the arbitration to the appropriate remedy. The Arbitrator ordered a "make-whole" remedy in the Award. DCPS seeks review of the Award on the grounds that the Award is contrary to law and public policy.<sup>2</sup> The Washington Teachers' Union, Local #6 (WTU) filed an opposition requesting that the Board deny DCPS's Request (Opposition).<sup>3</sup>

Upon consideration of the Arbitrator's conclusions, applicable law, and the record presented by the parties, the Board concludes that the Award is not contrary to law and public policy. Therefore, the Board denies DCPS's Request.

# **II.** Arbitration Award

# A. Background

The Grievant taught at Dunbar High School for nearly five (5) years.<sup>4</sup> The Grievant also worked with the after-school Twilight program, which is administered directly by DCPS and for which wages are paid by DCPS and incorporated into teachers' regular paychecks as "administrative pay."<sup>5</sup> The Grievant was an elected WTU building representative and supporter of WTU.<sup>6</sup> The Grievant was actively involved in a 2018 investigation by the D.C. Office of the State Superintendent of Education (OSSE) that concluded Dunbar High School had significant problems with "mismanagement or fraud in connection with inflated grades and falsified school attendance records."<sup>7</sup> During the 2018-2019 school year, the Principal and Assistant Principal of Dunbar High School each conducted in-class observations of the Grievant. The Principal and Assistant Principal posted low scores from each observation that resulted in an "Ineffective" rating and subjected the Grievant to immediate termination.<sup>8</sup> However, the Grievant was not terminated until June 25, 2019.<sup>9</sup>

The Grievant initiated the grievance process after the first observation and questioned whether the instructional observations were scheduled and conducted appropriately.<sup>10</sup> The grievance was denied on September 11, 2019.<sup>11</sup>

The grievance advanced to a hearing after a significant delay of over two (2) years.<sup>12</sup> The DCPS Hearing Officer found that the Principal and Assistant Principal at Dunbar High School "had not implemented the IMPACT evaluation system correctly, and that Grievant's termination therefore was in error and must be reversed."<sup>13</sup> The Hearing Officer cited a lack of thorough documentation of the second in-class observation to the extent that she questioned whether the observation had been performed at all.<sup>14</sup> The Hearing Officer issued three decisions on April 27, May 16, and May 17, 2022, all ordering that the Grievant be reinstated to his position at Dunbar High School.<sup>15</sup>

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Throughout the grievance process, the Grievant struggled to find employment in the education field as a result of being discharged by a major school system "for cause."<sup>16</sup> However, in August 2021, the Grievant was hired as a full-time teacher at Mount Vernon High School in Fairfax County, Virginia.<sup>17</sup> The Grievant accepted a salary at Mount Vernon High School significantly lower than his previous salary at Dunbar High School.<sup>18</sup> The Grievant also attested to, among other damages, a lost opportunity to apply for the forgiveness of his federal student loans through the Federal Teacher Loan Forgiveness program and, therefore, an obligation to continue making student loan payments. The Grievant further attested to his inability to complete the "Mind, Math and Multiliteracies Institute" graduate program at Georgetown University that required participants to make presentations to the schools at which they were employed, a condition the Grievant could not meet after he was terminated.<sup>19</sup>

After the Hearing Officer released her decisions, WTU demanded arbitration. DCPS communicated to the Union that it would not challenge the impropriety of the Grievant's termination or his reinstatement.<sup>20</sup> The parties agreed to arbitrate only the remedy.<sup>21</sup> WTU attempted to secure an offer of reinstatement from DCPS prior to Mount Vernon High School's teacher commitment deadline of June 15, 2022. However, DCPS did not make an offer to the Grievant for the 2022-2023 school year until September 8, 2022.<sup>22</sup> The Grievant, unable to rely on the pending offer from DCPS, renewed his position at Mount Vernon High School, which subjected him to severe penalties if he resigned that position before the end of the 2022-2023 academic year.<sup>23</sup>

# **B.** Arbitrator's Findings

The Arbitrator relied on his broad equitable powers to fashion an appropriate "make-whole" remedy.<sup>24</sup> The Arbitrator noted that the parties had a basic agreement to reinstate the Grievant and provide backpay but did not agree as to the calculation of backpay or to any other remedies.<sup>25</sup>

WTU sought multiple remedies for the Grievant and the Union. WTU requested that DCPS tender an offer of reinstatement to the Grievant prior to June 15, 2023.<sup>26</sup> WTU argued that the Grievant's lost income from the Twilight after-school program should be included in the calculation of backpay for lost wages.<sup>27</sup> WTU also requested that backpay calculations factor in the impacts of the new collective bargaining agreement (CBA) negotiated in 2022, including: (1)

any retroactive pay increases or pay supplements as if the Grievant had never been discharged; and (2) any step increases to which the Grievant would have been entitled.<sup>28</sup> WTU sought a backpay interest award at a rate of 4% per annum in order to mitigate the impact of depreciation on the value of the lump sum of the Grievant's backpay over time.<sup>29</sup> WTU further requested remedies to mitigate the impact of the Grievant's improper termination on his student loan payments, interest and eligibility for loan forgiveness.<sup>30</sup> These remedies included payment in the amount of the balance of his student loans at the time of the implementation of the Award and reimbursement for payments the Grievant's opportunity losses associated with the Georgetown University and OSSE "Mind, Math and Multiliteracies Institute," including the amount of the stipend the Grievant would have received and the estimated value of the academic credit-hours the Grievant would have earned.<sup>32</sup> WTU requested the Grievant receive a monetary "tax gross-up;" an additional lump sum to mitigate the taxation of the Grievant receiving the backpay award as a lump sum rather than as wages over multiple years.<sup>33</sup> Finally, WTU sought attorney fees.<sup>34</sup>

DCPS opposed several of the remedies sought by WTU. DCPS opposed the inclusion of the Grievant's lost income from the Twilight after-school program in backpay calculations because (1) the part-time Twilight program work was separate and apart from the Grievant's full-time teaching job; and (2) the Grievant was rendered ineligible for the Twilight program work after termination.<sup>35</sup> DCPS also opposed the award of attorney fees to WTU.<sup>36</sup> DCPS argued that an award of attorney fees conflicted with the express terms of the parties' CBA.<sup>37</sup> DCPS further argued that the Federal Back Pay Act did not apply to the case.<sup>38</sup>

The Arbitrator ordered the reinstatement of the Grievant's full seniority rights as if the termination had never occurred.<sup>39</sup> The Arbitrator further ordered that the Grievant's backpay calculations include retroactive pay increases or supplements and step increases–resulting from the parties' renegotiation of their CBA in 2022–as if the termination had never occurred.<sup>40</sup>

The Arbitrator determined that DCPS's oversight of the Twilight after-school program meant that the ancillary loss of the Twilight program's income stemmed directly from DCPS's

improper termination of the Grievant in his full-time teaching job.<sup>41</sup> The Arbitrator further ordered that the amount of backpay owed would be reduced by any unemployment compensation or interim income earnings the Grievant received between his termination and his reinstatement.<sup>42</sup> The Arbitrator also ordered the payment of interest on net back wages at a rate of 4% per annum, as proposed by WTU.<sup>43</sup> The Arbitrator found the proposed 4% rate reasonable and supported by the CMPA.<sup>44</sup> The Arbitrator further ordered DCPS to pay the Grievant the amounts that DCPS would have paid for all the benefits the Grievant would have received under the CBA between the time of his termination and projected reinstatement.<sup>45</sup>

The Arbitrator determined that the Grievant's loss of a monetary stipend and credit hours from the Georgetown University graduate program were a direct result of the Grievant's improper termination.<sup>46</sup> As such, the Arbitrator ordered payment of the lost stipend and the monetary value of the academic credit hours that the Grievant would have received.<sup>47</sup>

The Arbitrator rejected DCPS's argument that the parties' CBA precluded the application of the Federal Back Pay Act regarding WTU's request for attorney fees.<sup>48</sup> The Arbitrator noted that the Board had rejected this argument made by DCPS in a previous case in 2020.<sup>49</sup> The Arbitrator found that, while he had "not heard a full presentation of the evidence presented [to the DCPS Hearing Officer],"<sup>50</sup> the Hearing Officer's assessment indicated that the Agency's actions were "clearly without merit," "wholly unfounded," and "taken in bad faith."<sup>51</sup> The Arbitrator further concluded that the Hearing Officer's findings support the award of attorney fees.<sup>52</sup> The Arbitrator further noted that DCPS's untimely processing of the Hearing Officer's order to reinstate the Grievant forced the Grievant's hand in renewing his position at Mount Vernon High School, and that, if DCPS had made a timely offer, the matter might have been resolved at Step 2 of the grievance process without the need for arbitration or the Grievant and WTU incurring attorney fees.<sup>53</sup>

Finally, the Arbitrator determined that, despite a backpay settlement nominally equaling the amount of wages lost, the Grievant might receive a materially lower amount as a result of the tax differential in receiving the monetary amount of the award in a lump sum rather than incrementally over the span of multiple years.<sup>54</sup> The Arbitrator cited a growing concern among

adjudicators regarding the differential between the nominal amount of an award and the net posttaxation amount and a trend of awarding prevailing employee grievants a "tax gross-up."<sup>55</sup> Accordingly, the Arbitrator ordered DCPS to pay the Grievant an additional sum "to account for the difference in taxes he will owe on his award."<sup>56</sup>

# III. Discussion

Section 1-605.02(6) of the D.C. Official Code permits the Board to modify, set aside, or remand a grievance arbitration award in only three narrow circumstances: (1) if an arbitrator was without, or exceeded, his or her jurisdiction; (2) if the award on its face is contrary to law and public policy; or (3) if the award was procured by fraud, collusion or other similar and unlawful means.<sup>57</sup>

## A. The Award is not contrary to law and public policy.

DCPS requests the Board's review of the Award on the grounds that the Award is contrary to law and public policy.<sup>58</sup> The Board's review of an arbitration award on the grounds that it is contrary to law and public policy is an "extremely narrow" exception to the rule that reviewing bodies must defer to an arbitrator's ruling.<sup>59</sup> The narrow scope limits potentially intrusive judicial review under the guise of public policy.<sup>60</sup> The petitioning party has the burden to specify "applicable law and definite public policy that mandates that the Arbitrator arrive at a different result."<sup>61</sup> The Board may not modify or set aside an Award as contrary to law and public policy in the absence of a clear violation on the face of the Award.<sup>62</sup>

DCPS contests the monetary award in the amount of the Grievant's student loan balance. DCPS argues that the Arbitrator "bypassed any inquiry to determine whether the Grievant's loan would have been legally eligible for forgiveness,"<sup>63</sup> therefore substituting the judgment of Congress and the Secretary of the Department of Education with his own.<sup>64</sup> However, the Arbitrator has not made any determination on the Grievant's eligibility for student loan forgiveness or ordered DCPS "to pay off the Grievant's student loans,"<sup>65</sup> but rather provided a lump sum *in*

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*the amount of* the Grievant's outstanding student loan debt as part of a "make-whole" remedy.<sup>66</sup> Furthermore, during the grievance process, DCPS offered to pay off "the principal of [the Grievant's] [Federal Family Education Loan],"<sup>67</sup> undercutting DCPS's assertion that a payment in the amount of the Grievant's outstanding student loan balance substitutes the judgment of Congress and the Secretary of the Department of Education.

DCPS also opposes the remedy of a monetary sum in the amount of the estimated value of the graduate-level academic credits that the Grievant could have earned.<sup>68</sup> DCPS argues that awarding the monetary value of the credit hours the Grievant would have received if he had completed the graduate program at Georgetown University violates the Anti-Deficiency Act, which prohibits D.C. agency employees from "[obligating] the District for the payment of money before an appropriation is made."<sup>69</sup> However, in this case the payment is not an "appropriation" for the theoretical earning of credits, but a monetary lump sum awarded by the Arbitrator as part of a "make-whole" remedy for a grievance put before that Arbitrator mutually by the parties. Therefore, the Anti-Deficiency Act is not relevant to the determination of the suitability of that remedy.

DCPS argues that the Arbitrator lacked authority to grant "additional money to cover the Grievant's future tax liability."<sup>70</sup> DCPS cites two D.C. Circuit Court cases where the court declined to extend case law to explicitly provide for the court's provision of tax gross-up remedies.<sup>71</sup> However, both cases have received negative treatments in more recent 9th Circuit and Court of Federal Claims cases.<sup>72</sup> Furthermore, a more recent D.C. Circuit Court case has held that neither of the cases explicitly foreclosed "any claim for tax gross-ups."<sup>73</sup> Also, recent National Labor Relations Board rulings have created precedent for such "tax gross-up" remedies.<sup>74</sup> In the

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absence of any contractual restrictions, we find the ability to order monetary remedies such as the "tax gross-up" are within the arbitrator's authority to determine an appropriate equitable remedy.<sup>75</sup>

Finally, DCPS argues, in the alternative, that if the Board does not set aside the disputed remedies, the case should be remanded back to the Arbitrator, citing the U.S. Supreme Court case *Florida Power & Light v. Lorion* in support of the request for a remand.<sup>76</sup> DCPS cites a portion of *Florida Power & Light v. Lorion* stating:

If the record before the agency does not support the agency action, if the agency has not considered all relevant factors, or if the reviewing court simply cannot evaluate the challenged agency action on the basis of the record before it, the proper course, except in rare circumstances, is to remand to the agency for additional investigation or explanation. The reviewing court is not generally empowered to conduct a *de novo* inquiry into the matter being reviewed and to reach its own conclusions based on such an inquiry.<sup>77</sup>

However, the Arbitrator here is not an "agency" or a "reviewing court" that lacks a sufficient factual record to evaluate a challenged agency action. In addition, DCPS stipulated to the impropriety of its action as an Agency in firing the Grievant. DCPS's arguments are mere disagreements with the Arbitrator's findings and interpretation of applicable laws. A mere disagreement with the Arbitrator "does not make the award contrary to law"<sup>78</sup> and public policy.<sup>79</sup>

DCPS has not sufficiently demonstrated that the remedies provided for in this Award are inappropriate. Therefore, the Board finds that the Award is not on its face contrary to law and public policy.

# B. WTU's request for costs is granted in part.

The Arbitrator granted actual, reasonable attorney fees to WTU for the grievance and arbitration process, which DCPS has not disputed in this Request. The Board need not disturb nor address the Arbitrator's award of attorney fees to WTU for that proceeding.

WTU argues that DCPS's Request is "meritless and frivolous,"<sup>80</sup> and therefore WTU should receive reasonable costs and attorney fees for litigating the Arbitration Review Request itself.<sup>81</sup> The Board has awarded attorney fees specifically in unfair labor practice cases and declines to extend that authority in this case.<sup>82</sup> However, the Board has long held that it will award

other reasonable costs on a case-by-case basis.<sup>83</sup> The Board has adopted a test to determine whether an award of costs is "in the interest of justice

First, any such award of costs necessarily assumes that the party to whom the payment is to be made was successful in at least a significant part of the case, and that the costs in question are attributable to that part. Second, it is clear on the [face] of the statute that it is only those costs that are "reasonable" that may be ordered reimbursed... Last, and this is the [crux] of the matter, we believe such an award must be shown to be in the interest of justice.

Just what characteristics of a case will warrant the finding that an award of costs will be in the interest of justice cannot be exhaustively catalogued...what we can say here is that among the situation [sic] in which such an award is appropriate are those in which the losing party's claim or position was wholly without merit, those in which the successfully challenged action was undertaken in bad faith, and those in which a reasonably foreseeable result of the successfully challenged conduct is the undermining of the union among the employees for whom it is the exclusive representative.<sup>84</sup>

Here, DCPS stipulated to the Arbitrator that the Grievant was improperly terminated. DCPS relies primarily on semantic arguments regarding the "forgiveness" of student loans rather than a monetary award in the amount of the Grievant's outstanding student loans and inapplicable sections of the CMPA such as the Anti-Deficiency Act. DCPS should have known that it would not prevail on the merits in bringing this Request before the Board. Therefore, although the Board does not award attorney fees for this arbitration review request proceeding, the Board finds that awarding WTU reasonable costs for litigating this Request is in the interest of justice.

# IV. Conclusion

The Board rejects DCPS's arguments and finds no cause to modify, set aside, or remand the Award. Accordingly, DCPS's Request is denied, and the matter is dismissed in its entirety.

# PEPRADR-2023-01, THE POTOMAC ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY'S RESIDENTIAL AID DISCOUNT COMPLIANCE REPORTS AND FILINGS,

1. The Public Service Commission of the District of Columbia (Commission) hereby gives notice, pursuant to Section 34-802 of the District of Columbia Official Code and in accordance with Section 2-505 of the District of Columbia Official Code<sup>1</sup> of its intent to act upon the Potomac Electric Power Company's (Pepco or Company) Rider - Residential Aid Discount Surcharge (Rider RADS) filed on April 10, 2023,<sup>2</sup> in not less than thirty (30) days from the date of publication of this Notice of Proposed Tariff (NOPT) in the *D.C. Register*.

2. The Residential Aid Discount (RAD) Surcharge allows Pepco to recover the costs of the subsidy for the RAD Program for low-income electricity customers in the District of Columbia.<sup>3</sup> Pepco is required to file a true-up for the surcharge on an annual basis, in the event of an over or under-collection of the RAD Surcharge and to address any changes in income eligibility criteria.<sup>4</sup> By Order No. 18059, the Commission adopted a methodology for computing the RAD, changing it to reflect a Residential Aid Credit (RAC).<sup>5</sup> On April 10, 2023, Pepco filed its annual update to the Rider RADS.

3. Pepco explains that each RAD Surcharge filing consists of two main parts, the trueup from previous periods and the costs associated with RADS based on estimated costs for the next period, which typically is a year. In its filing, Pepco provides the RADS true-up calculation from March 2022 through May 2023.<sup>6</sup> According to Pepco, the RAD Surcharge collections from March 2022 through February 2023 resulted in an under-collection of \$1,485,427.<sup>7</sup> Pepco shows

the forecasted under-collection of \$389,066 from March through May 2023, which is also included in the calculation of the surcharge.<sup>8</sup>

4. Pepco asserts that the estimated cost of the RAC from June 2023 through May 2024 is \$11,240,811.<sup>9</sup> Pepco maintains that as a result of the under-collection from June 2016 through May 2023 and increased participation driving the higher program cost of the RAC from June 2023 through May 2024, the proposed RAD Surcharge would increase from the current surcharge rate of \$0.000939 per kilowatt-hour, which became effective July 1, 2022, to \$0.001391 per kilowatt-hour with a projected effective date of July 1, 2023.<sup>10</sup> The Company asserts that it is supportive of increasing future subsidy levels as needed to accommodate participation growth.<sup>11</sup>

# ZONING COMMISSION FOR THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA ZONING COMMISSION ORDER NO. 06-27A Z.C. Case No. 06-27A Square 54 Office Owner, LLC (Modification of Consequence of Approved PUD @ Square 54, Lot 7011 [2200 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W.]) April 27, 2023

Pursuant to notice, at its April 27, 2023 public meeting, the Zoning Commission for the District of Columbia ("Commission") considered the application ("Application") of Square 54 Office Owner, LLC ("Applicant") for a Modification of Consequence to make minor adjustments to the rooftop shown on the approved plans of the approved Planned Unit Development ("PUD") granted in Z.C. Order No. 06-27 for Lot 7011 in Square 54, with a street address of 2200 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W. ("Property"). The Commission reviewed the Application pursuant to the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, which are codified in Subtitle Z of Title 11 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (Zoning Regulations of 2016, the "Zoning Regulations", to which all subsequent citations refer unless otherwise specified). For the reasons stated below, the Commission **APPROVES** the Application.

# FINDINGS OF FACT

# I. <u>BACKGROUND</u>

## Prior Approvals

1. Pursuant to Z.C. Order No. 06-27 (the "Order"), the Commission approved a Consolidated PUD and related amendment to the Zoning Map for the construction of a mixed-use building containing residential, office, and retail uses ("Project"). Condition 1 of the Order requires that the Project be constructed in accordance with the plans reviewed and approved by the Commission, including certain requirements for the rooftop ("Approved Plans").

# **Parties and Notice**

- 2. The following were automatically parties to this proceeding pursuant to Subtitle Z § 403.5:
  - The Applicant;
  - Advisory Neighborhood Commission ("ANC") 2A; and
  - In addition, Foggy Bottom Association ("FBA") and the West End Citizens Association ("WECA") were parties to the original proceeding.
- 3. On March 10, 2023, the Applicant served the Application on ANC 2A, FBA, and WECA as well as the Office of Planning ("OP") and the District Department of Transportation ("DDOT") as attested by the Certificate of Service submitted with the Application. (Exhibit [Ex.] 2, p. 4.)

# II. <u>THE APPLICATION</u>

4. On March 10, 2023, the Applicant filed the Application requesting a Modification of Consequence to request minor changes to the rooftop as approved in the Approved Plans, including relocation of the green roof, installing a trellis, updating materials, and adding

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furniture. (Ex. 2, pp. 1-2.) The Application included updated plans showing the proposed rooftop modifications and photomontage studies. (Ex. 2D1-2D3.)

- 5. The Applicant explained that the proposed changes would create more meaningful amenity space for the Property's office tenants and that outdoor amenity space had become an increasingly important feature demanded by the post-pandemic office market. (Ex. 2, p. 2.)
- 6. On April 26, 2023, the Applicant filed a supplemental statement providing additional detail on the proposed modification, including an updated rendering showing the new guardrail material, accent slats, and paver materials. The rendering also showed the proposed fixtures and equipment, including freestanding planters, a fire pit, and a mounted TV. (Ex. 6, 6A.)

# III. <u>RESPONSES TO THE APPLICATION</u>

# **OP Report**

7. On April 6, 2023, OP submitted a report ("OP Report") recommending approval of the Application. OP concluded that the Application could appropriately be considered as a modification of consequence, would be generally consistent with the intent of the original approval, and should not have significant detrimental impacts to the design of the Project. OP noted that the required amount of green roof would be maintained and that the trellis would be small and have minimal visibility from surrounding public spaces. OP asked the Applicant to provide more details about the materials and the extent of the changes. (Ex. 5.)

# ANC Report

8. On March 27, 2023, ANC 2A submitted a report stating that at its regularly scheduled duly noticed public meeting on March 15, 2023, with a quorum present, the ANC voted 6-0-1 to support the Application. (Ex. 4.)

# **Other Parties**

9. FBA and WECA did not submit responses on the Application.

# **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- 1. Subtitle Z § 703.1 authorizes the Commission, in the interest of efficiency, to make Modifications of Consequence to final orders and plans without a public hearing.
- 2. Subtitle Z § 703.3 defines a Modification of Consequence as "a modification to a contested case order or the approved plans that is neither a minor modification nor a modification of significance."
- 3. Subtitle Z § 703.4 includes "a redesign or relocation of architectural elements and open spaces from the final design approved by the Commission" as an example of a Modification of Consequence.

- 4. The Commission concludes that the Applicant satisfied the requirement of Subtitle Z § 703.13 to serve the Application on all parties to the original proceeding, in this case ANC 2A, FBA, and WECA.
- 5. The Commission concludes that the Application qualifies as a Modification of Consequence within the meaning of Subtitle Z §§ 703.3 and 703.4, as a request to modify the plans approved by the Commission, and therefore the modification can be granted without a public hearing.
- 6. At its April 13, 2023 public meeting, the Commission established a timeframe for FBA and WECA to respond to the Application pursuant to the requirement of Subtitle Z § 703.17(c)(2). As noted above, FBA and WECA did not submit responses on the Application.
- 7. At its April 27, 2023 public meeting, the Commission deliberated and found the proposed adjustments to the rooftop consistent with the intent and goals of the PUD as approved by the Order.

# **"GREAT WEIGHT" TO THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF OP**

- The Commission is required to give "great weight" to the recommendation of OP pursuant to § 5 of the Office of Zoning Independence Act of 1990, effective September 20, 1990 (D.C. Law 8-163; D.C. Official Code § 6-623.04 (2018 Repl.)) and Subtitle Z § 405.8. (Metropole Condo. Ass'n v. D.C. Bd. of Zoning Adjustment, 141 A.3d 1079, 1087 (D.C. 2016).)
- 9. The Commission finds OP's recommendation to approve the Application persuasive and concurs in that judgment.

# **"GREAT WEIGHT" TO THE WRITTEN REPORT OF THE ANC**

- 10. The Commission must give "great weight" to the issues and concerns raised in a written report of the affected ANC that was approved by the full ANC at a properly noticed meeting that was open to the public pursuant to § 13(d) of the Advisory Neighborhood Commissions Act of 1975, effective March 26, 1976 (D.C. Law 1-21; D.C. Official Code § 1-309.10(d) (2012 Repl.)) and Subtitle Z § 406.2. To satisfy the great weight requirement, the Commission must articulate with particularity and precision the reasons why an affected ANC does or does not offer persuasive advice under the circumstances. (Metropole Condo. Ass'n v. D.C. Bd. of Zoning Adjustment, 141 A.3d 1079, 1087 (D.C. 2016).) The District of Columbia Court of Appeals has interpreted the phrase "issues and concerns" to "encompass only legally relevant issues and concerns." (Wheeler v. District of Columbia Board of Zoning Adjustment, 395 A.2d 85, 91 n.10 (1978) (citation omitted).")
- 11. The Commission finds ANC 2A's recommendation to approve the Application persuasive and concurs in that judgment.

## **DECISION**

In consideration of the case record and the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law herein, the Commission concludes that the Applicant has satisfied its burden of proof and therefore **APPROVES** the Application's request for a Modification of Consequence to the Approved Plans in Z.C. Order No. 06-27 to permit modification of the rooftop.

The conditions of Z.C. Order No. 06-27 remain unchanged and in effect, except as follows (additions shown in **bold** and <u>underlined</u> text):

Condition 1 is hereby revised to read as follows:

1. This PUD shall be developed in accordance with the plans prepared by Pelli Clarke Pelli Architects and Sasaki & Associates marked as Exhibits 4, 20, 36, 83, and 92 in the record, as modified by guidelines, conditions, and standards herein; and as modified by the plans shown in Exhibits 2D1-2D3 and 6A of the record of Z.C. Case No. 06-27A.

**VOTE** (April 27, 2023): **4-0-1** 

(Anthony J. Hood, Robert E. Miller, Peter G. May, and Joseph S. Imamura to **APPROVE**; 3<sup>rd</sup> Mayoral appointee seat vacant).
